2. Introduction to the project

- The project was funded under the <u>RCUK Digital Economy Theme</u> <u>Sustainable Society</u> <u>Network +</u> coordinated by <u>Imperial College London</u>.

- The initial pilot project study had a funded 6 month duration from August 2014.

- The research built and continues to build on previous work on the <u>Heritage Lottery Fund</u>
 <u>Discover Bute Landscape Partnership Scheme</u>, in particular work led by Paul Duffy and
 taken forward as Brandanii Archaeology and Heritage

- The pilot project was conducted alongside the <u>Pararchive Project</u> which concerns digital storytelling and the development and use of archive material and which had a Community Group based on the Isle of Bute. The direct involvement of the research team in the <u>Pararchive Project</u> gave this pilot project a major boost to help it build further on much other previous research.

- Our team persists to complete a final report and develop a funding application that will
 hopefully fuel a larger project with a bigger scope to look at Bute and its linked
 connections and the mapping of its past, present and future and the development of the
 place in more detail as super fast broadband takes hold and sets to change things,
 hopefully for the better, and develop new opportunities for sustainable development and
 prosperous thriving for all on the <u>Isle of Bute</u> and those that visit and otherwise interact
 with its placemaking.

2.2. Purpose of the study

- It aimed to investigating the potential that digital heritage (history) holds for the development of a more sustainable society on the <u>Isle of Bute</u>.
 - The island has a rich cultural history and many heritage assets.

- To what extent can these assets be better promoted and marketed and to what extent can these contribute to a sustainable tourist economy and island identity?
- The arrival of high speed/<u>superfast broadband</u> offers exciting possibilities for the people of Bute to promote local business and local places via digital technologies.
 - In time this will further open up Bute heritage and attractions to a wider, global audience.
 - It will also in time lead to some digital transformational changes on the island that have been commonly happened elsewhere.
- At the start of the project high speed community broadband (as it was called then) was scheduled to be available across the island by some time in 2016. It is likely that some parts of the island, most probably parts of the main town - <u>Rothesay</u> will be connected first (and perhaps as early as late summer 2015), and that more remote areas will not be served with such superfast internet connectivity until considerably later.
- The pilot Island Stories project aims to investigate what is wanted and useful and how
 the island community might be helped to research, communicate and promote their
 cultural assets in readiness for and over the course of the introduction of high speed
 broadband.
- We hope that this pilot project will gain funding for a larger, longer project in 2015 and 2016 that conducts impactful research that oversees the changes that take place as high speed broadband becomes available and aims to make these changes better for all.

2.3. Getting involved

- We want to hear about experiences (good or bad) of using (or not using) digital technologies on Bute. What kind of 'stories' would you like to read, develop and tell about Bute, and how do you think the island community can work together to promote and communicate these assets through digital methods? What kinds of help, planning and training are wanted especially in preparation for the arrival of higher speed broadband on Bute?
- In September 2014 we launched a survey which was distributed on paper and was also made available online.
 - The survey is now closed, and we are analysing the results which will be synthesised to form the basis of some of the findings and a large section of the final report.
- The research team conducted interviews to gather some more in-depth views.
 - Primarily we targeted those in some way associated with Island heritage, but we tried to gather a wide range of views from residents, ex-residents, visitors and ex-visitors.
 - We are currently not arranging further interviews, but if you are keen to be interviewed or get involved in any follow up study, please email or contact Paul Duffy or <u>Penny Rivlin</u> in the first instance.
- Another way to get involved is to develop some online digital content about Bute, perhaps you edit <u>OpenStreetMap</u> already, or <u>Wikipedia</u>? Maybe you would also like to contribute something to the <u>Island Stories Google Maps Engine Map</u>

- This was set up when we thought this technology would be around for longer, but it is being phased out and the map may no longer be available after some time in 2016.
 - Meanwhile we are working on a way to export the content and have a more sustainable resource for developing this.
