Font	Times New Roman. Main text 11 pt; abstract 10 pt; title 16 pt bold.
Spacing	Single spacing. Paragraphs justified. Avoid excessive blank lines.
Language	English is preferred for international dissemination. Consistent academic English should be used throughout.
Length	Suggested 6–12 pages including tables, figures, notes, and references.
Structure	Title; Author(s); Affiliation(s); Corresponding Author; Abstract; Keywords; Introduction; Literature Review/Theoretical Framework; Research Method; Results and Discussion; Conclusion and Implications; Acknowledgements (optional); References.
Tables & figures	Number consecutively. Table titles appear above tables; figure titles appear below figures. Each must be cited in the text and include a source note when relevant.
Citations	APA 7th edition, author–date system. Reference managers such as Zotero, Mendeley, or EndNote are recommended.
Originality	Submitted papers must be original, unpublished, and not under simultaneous review elsewhere, unless explicitly permitted by the conference committee.
