LPS OPEN ENROLLMENT - 2020-2021



Please check the <u>Arapahoe High School open enrollment page</u> for school specific application requirements.

The First Open Enrollment Application Window Opened October 1, 2020

LPS offers many educational choices to resident and non-resident families and welcomes out-of-district students. Resident families may attend their attendance-area school or apply for open enrollment at another LPS school.

In an effort to better serve families, LPS now offers two open enrollment windows. All qualified students who apply within an open enrollment window will be part of a random drawing for acceptance, following district enrollment guidelines. This means families will have several weeks to turn in open enrollment applications for a random drawing of qualified students. Families will no longer feel pressured to line up on October 1st to turn in applications for open enrollment. Open enrollment applications must be turned in to each requested school. Families are encouraged to apply during window one.

Enrollment for the 2021–2022 school year is as follows:

- Enrollment Window One begins October 1, 2020 and ends November 13, 2020. Students will be notified by the end of the first full week in December (December 11, 2020). Students who apply, and are not chosen in Open Enrollment Window One, will be placed on a waitlist. Should space become available, a random drawing, based on LPS Open Enrollment Guidelines will occur. Additionally, students who applied in Open Enrollment Window One, will be placed in the random drawing before students who applied during Open Enrollment Window Two.
- Enrollment Window Two begins November 16, 2020 and ends the first Friday following winter break (January 8, 2021). Students will be notified by the second Friday of the second semester (January 15, 2021).
- Because preschool and kindergarten registration does not take place until January, families will be notified of open enrollment acceptance by the end of January.

Open Enrollment Guidelines:

- District residents have priority consideration over non-residents.
- There is space available at the student's grade level.

- There is a school program appropriate for the enrolling student.
- The student must be in good standing, grades, attendance and behavior, in his or her previous school.
- Good standing applies to resident and non-resident students seeking new and continuing open enrollment.
- Open enrolled students must re-apply at level changes, elementary to middle, and middle to high.
- Open enrolled students wanting to continue at the same school next year must complete an "Intent to Renew" form. This must be done each year by January 8.

As recommended by the Long Range Planning Committee, the following groups of students will be given preferential open enrollment when the new boundaries go into effect (for the fall of 2021):

- All high school students who no longer live in their current school's boundary zone;
- 4th graders going into 5th grade who no longer live in their current school's boundary zone; and
- 7th graders going into 8th grade who no longer live in their current school's boundary zone.

No transportation services will be provided in conjunction with these preferential open enrollment options.





News from the Post Grad Department

Seniors! Please read this important application related information:

College Application Tracking Form

The form (one for each college) is due at least **10 school days** before the college application deadline. To see tracking form deadlines, click here.

- The form is actually a **checklist of required items to complete in Naviance** so that supplemental materials (transcript, school report, recommendation) can be sent on your behalf. Merely submitting the form does not mean that items will be sent, if the items have not actually been completed in Naviance.
- Check your email to see if your forms remain unprocessed! Mrs. Arnold is emailing the student, a parent/guardian, and the student's counselor when a form is submitted, but Naviance tasks are incomplete.
- If you need assistance:
 - See the screencast tutorials in Google Classroom for step by step instructions.
 - o Contact Mrs. Arnold with questions on a form that has already been submitted.

The status of your <u>teacher</u> letter of recommendation can be found on the Naviance letter of recommendation page. One of three options will appear:

- 1. Requested the student has made an official request
- 2. **In-progress -** the teacher has uploaded the letter to Naviance, but it has not yet been sent to colleges. If the electronic College Application Tracking Form has been submitted, the recommendation is likely within the 10 day processing window. Alternatively, there may be an issue with the College Application Tracking Form, which is preventing the recommendation from being sent.
- 3. **Submitted** the recommendation has been sent to colleges

Register for a <u>UC Application workshop</u>, hosted by UCSB, to receive tips and recommendations on how to fill out the UC application, which will be helpful for students applying to any UC school. Workshops will be offered every Thursday at 5:00 pm until November 19th.

Juniors and Seniors! Virtual college visits take place each Wednesday until Thanksgiving Break. The full listing is available on the College Visit Calendar on the Post Grad website. Students then log in to Naviance to sign up for the visit. (Colleges tab, colleges home, scroll down to the bottom of the page). The link to the virtual meeting will post in Naviance 15 minutes prior to the visit. High Performance Tutoring is offering free ACT/SAT virtual tutoring sessions each Thursday. 




