Language conventions and usage	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Utilizes appropriate capitalization, punctuation, and spelling when writing ● Utilizes standard English grammar when writing and speaking
Vocabulary	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Notices differences between literal and figurative language ● Uses strategies to determine the meaning of an unknown word ● Uses acquired words and phrases when speaking and writing
Speaking and Listening	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Stays on topic ● Asks and answers questions during whole class or group discussions ● Speaks and listens in formal and informal ways, like presentations and conversations. ● Presents information with appropriate facts and relevant, descriptive details

Foundational Skills	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Sounds out words with two or more syllables ● Reads grade-appropriate irregularly spelled words ● Reads aloud smoothly, not just one word at a time ● Notices and tries to fix mistakes while reading
Literature	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Asks and answers questions about key details in a literary text using evidence from the text ● Reads two or more books on the same topic; notices what is the same and different ● Understands a story's lesson or message ● Describes characters in a story; explains how their actions affect what happens ● Develops written constructed responses using specific details and evidence from the text ● Uses pictures, headings, and other visual clues to help understand a story ● Compares and contrasts themes, settings, and plots of stories written by the same author about the same/similar characters
Informational Text	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Asks and answers questions about key details in an informational text using evidence from the text and refers explicitly to the text ● Determines the main idea of a text; explains how key details support the main idea. ● Develops written constructed responses using specific details and evidence from the text ● Compares and contrasts the most important points and key details presented by two texts on the same topic ● Uses pictures, headings, and other visual clues to help understand an article

Text Types and Purposes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Writes narrative pieces (real or imagined) with a well-elaborated event, details, words that signal event order, and a sense of closure ● Writes informative pieces with well-developed ideas, information, and a conclusion ● Writes opinion pieces supporting a point of view with relevant reasons and a conclusion ● Produces writing in which the development and organization are appropriate to task, purpose, and audience. ● Organizes writing in ways that help readers understand; uses linking words and phrases like “another reason” and “after that” to connect ideas and information ● Refers to specific parts of a text when speaking or writing about what it means ● Uses technology to produce and publish writing (using keyboarding skills)
Research	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Uses books as well as other sources (like videos and websites) when doing research ● Takes brief notes on sources and sort evidence into provided categories
Revising and Editing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Improves writing by making changes. Changes can be larger (like explaining ideas more fully) or smaller (like fixing spelling mistakes)

Mathematical Practices	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Efficiently and flexibly applies strategies to solve problems ● Persists when solving problems ● Clearly communicates mathematical thinking
Operations and Algebraic Thinking	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Represents and solves problems involving multiplication and division ● Understands properties of multiplication and the relationship between multiplication and division ● Flexibly and efficiently multiplies and divides within 100. By the end of grade 3 knows multiplication and division facts up to $9 \times 9 = 81$ and $81 \div 9 = 9$ ● Solves problems involving the four operations, and identifies and explains patterns in arithmetic

Mathematics (Continued)	Indicator Description
Number and Operations in Base Ten	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Uses place value understanding and properties of operations to perform multi-digit arithmetic ● Flexibly and efficiently adds and subtracts within 1,000 using strategies and algorithms based on place value, properties of operations, and/or the relationship between addition and subtraction
Numbers and Operations - Fractions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Demonstrates an understanding of fractions as part of a whole for fractions with denominators of 2,3, 4, 6 and 8 ● Explains equivalence of fractions and compares fractions ● Understands a fraction as a number on a number line
Measurement and Data	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Solves problems using units of time (like minutes), mass (like grams), and volume (like liters) ● Understands and uses area and perimeter. Finds the area and perimeter of shapes like rectangles ● Represents and interprets data to create line plots, picture graphs, and bar graphs
Geometry	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Sorts shapes into categories: for example, shapes with right (90°) angles ● Partitions shapes into equal parts and expresses the area of each part as a unit fraction of the whole

Concepts and Skills	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Demonstrates knowledge of Social Studies content and concepts ● Evaluates sources and uses evidence

Science	Indicator Description
Concepts and Skills	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Demonstrates knowledge of scientific concepts and content ● Asks questions (for science) and defines problems (for engineering) ● Plans and carries out investigations ● Constructs explanations (for science) and designs solutions (for engineering)
