Name Change Info

Legal Name Change for All Counties in the State of Michigan

Est. Cost (last updated Oct 2020) for legal name change, it could be more or less depending on many factors:

Court Fees: \$175 filing fee

Background check: \$42

Published announcement: \$55

Total Est. Cost: \$272

** there may be additional fees associated with updating your name on each identifying document you need updated (ID, passport, etc.)

**background check not required for petitioners age 22 and under

Legal Name Change for Ingham County:

The Family Division hears change of name petitions. Persons for whom a name change is being sought must be a resident of Ingham County for a year prior to filing the petition. Petitions can be obtained and are filed in the Circuit Court Clerk's office.

Legal Name Change on a Michigan Birth Certificate: Legal Name change on a birth certificate can be completed for \$50 after the court grants the legal name change petition, as long as the person was born in Michigan. Rules are state dependent. If the person was born in a different state they will need to follow the rules for that specific state.

Updating Your Legal Name Only (no gender marker update) on an Existing Valid Passport: When you already have a valid Passport, you may submit a *Passport Renewal Application* to change your legal name on the passport by mail. You will need to complete and submit:

1. A Passport Renewal Application ([Form DS-82](#));
2. Your most recent Passport (book or card);
3. A recent color photograph 2x2 inches in size;
4. Order for Name Change (certified copy showing a seal and officiate/judge signature);
5. Fee (See [Department of State Passport Fees](#) for cost).

Gender Marker Change

Correcting your Gender Marker Change on a Michigan ID or Driver's License

Big thank you to Governor Whitmore! People who would like to correct the sex designation on their driver's license or ID card only need to fill out a form, go to a Secretary of State branch to have their photo taken and pay the \$9 correction fee for a driver's license, or \$10 for a state ID. They will no longer need to provide a birth certificate, passport or court order, as was required under the old policy for changing the sex-indicator on a driver's license.

Updating Your Gender Marker on an Existing Passport or Getting a Passport for the First Time

If you are applying to change your gender marker, submitting a passport application for the first time, or applying for a passport when your old passport has expired, *you must apply in person*.

You will need to complete and submit:

1. Application for U.S. Passport ([Form DS-11](#));
2. Proof of U.S. Citizenship (such as a previous U.S. Passport, certified Birth Certificate, Certificate of Naturalization, or Report of Birth Abroad);
3. Proof of Identity that contains your signature and photograph that is "a good likeness to you" (such as a previous U.S. Passport, a Driver's License, a Certificate of Naturalization, Military Identification, or a Government Employee Identification Card). You must present the original AND provide a photocopy of the front and back side with your application;

4. A recent color photograph 2x2 inches in size;
5. If you are changing your name on your passport, an Order for Name Change (certified copy showing a seal and officiate/judge signature);
6. A letter from your Physician confirming your gender transition (*the requirements for this letter are listed below*); and
7. Fee (See [*Department of State Passport Fees*](#) for cost).

Take these documents and fees in person to any Passport Acceptance Facility.
