

A man impersonating a casino owner took home \$1 million

Identity theft or fraud, in which a 23-year-old man allegedly obtained more than \$1 million after being accused of impersonating a hotel owner in Las Vegas, is a criminal activity that fraudulently acquires services or goods using information from other individuals, a new report says. In Nevada, identity theft is an offense punishable by up to 20 years in prison with a fine of up to \$100,000. While such crimes are not uncommon, it is really difficult for criminals to hide their traces that usually result in their capture. [파칭코사이트인포](#)

Now, a new report suggests a person could almost pull off a scam that allegedly earned him more than \$1 million by pretending to be the owner of a Las Vegas hotel casino. According to a report by KLAS, a 23-year-old man named Eric Gutierrez was charged with theft of more than \$100,000 after impersonating a Las Vegas hotel owner for money.

The fraud allegations date back to the release of the latest report citing court documents earlier this month when an "unknown person" entered the downtown Las Vegas Surca Hotel & Casino and approached a cage clerk for money. The man reportedly claimed to be the owner of the hotel and asked the counter staff to give him the money he falsely paid to the fire department.
