8TH GRADE APPRENTICE OPPORTUNITY AT ELI WHITNEY

The Apprentice Program is a paid educational program for students in 8th grade who are 13 years and up. Apprentices come to us with a wide range of interest in areas of focus, career opportunities, and academic paths. Students learn how to research, design, and produce projects ranging from electronics, to video game design, engineering architectural feats, bringing to life ancient cultures, *and* much much more- then then learn how to teach those projects to younger students. They work alongside the museum staff and guest artists and educators to explore their interests and to be trained on tools and techniques to make those interests come to fruition. Apprentices also gain invaluable life skills by being urged to communicate openly, problem solve, and collaborate with others through a variety of challenges. COVID TESTING PROGRAM

New Haven Public Schools is starting a voluntary free weekly COVID-19 testing program, called Project COVID DeteCT to help keep our students and community safe and help prevent the spread of COVID-19. Regular COVID-19 testing of students and staff will help us lower the risk of the disease in our schools by finding positive cases of COVID-19 quickly. The testing program will also help identify positive cases in people who do not show any symptoms. Testing will allow us to maintain regular in-person learning while making everyone feel safer when in-person. For more information about this program:

We hope that you will participate by signing a consent form for your student. To sign electronically, follow this link: bit.ly/3giEF2x. Each school needs at least 20 students to participate, so please help spread the word. The more students who participate, the safer our schools will be!

What is the COVID-19 testing program?

- Participating students will be tested for COVID-19 once a week by staff from Quest Diagnostics
- The program is currently in progress
- The test is performed at your school.
- The COVID-19 test is quick, easy and it does not hurt.
- A nasal test gently swabs the lower inner nostril.
- Testing is sent to the lab.
- Lab results are sent to the parent within 24 hours.
- The test is free. You do not need to pay for the test or have insurance to get the test.
- The program is optional, but we hope you will participate to help us stop the spread of COVID-19.

How can my student participate in the program?

To participate in the testing program, you need to sign a consent form for your student: bit.ly/3giEF2x. You only need to sign up once for the weekly testing. Student information will only be shared with the Department of Public Health and New Haven Health Department if a student tests positive in an individual test.

The program is voluntary. Students are not required to participate in the program. We strongly encourage your student to participate to help us reduce the spread of the COVID-19 disease.

PICKUP REMINDERS

Parents/Guardians- Please be sure to scan the QR code only when you arrive at the school, and not prior to arrival. This is our way of knowing that you are on-site and ready to receive your student. We continue to have early entries submitted and students are sent out to wait, only for us to determine that their parent/guardian has not yet arrived. Your cooperation is much appreciated. Additionally, all parents/guardians must be on the blacktop in order for us to release students (unless you are on the playground picking up from K).

PARKING REMINDERS

We must stress the importance of following our drop-off and pick up procedures for the safety of our students, families, and staff at all times. **There is absolutely NO DROP-OFF in front of Edgewood on Yale Avenue.** The only drop-off that occurs is in the bus lane for BUSES ONLY. Please do not drive your car through the bus lane to drop off your child. If you would like to park and walk your child into school, please do so using the designated parking spaces further down from the school on Yale or on Edgewood and West Rock. Furthermore, do not block the driveways of any surrounding homes, or park in non-designated spots such as crosswalks and bus or bike lanes. We must have all families adhere to these guidelines in order to maintain safe conditions for all. Thank you and please reach out with any questions.
