How is Cub Scouting Organized?

Pack

The Pack is made up of several Dens. The make-up and size of the Pack varies based on local interest and resources. Each Pack is identified by a number. We are Pack 4571!

Dens

A small group of Cub Scouts who are in the same grade. The ideal size is 6 to 8 Cub Scouts per Den.

Chartered Organization (First Lutheran Church)

This is the organization that partners with the Boy Scouts of America to deliver a Scouting program. They adopt Scouting to serve the youth in the community.

Chartered Organization Representative

This person appoints the Pack Committee Chair and approves all adult leaders. They provide resources from the chartered organization.

Pack Committee Chair

The top volunteer in the Pack is the Pack Committee Chair. They are responsible for ensuring enough qualified adult volunteers are in place to provide the program. They lead the Pack Committee meetings.

Pack Committee

Made up of parents, leaders, and other caring adults the Pack Committee works to support Den Leaders and the Cubmaster.

Cubmaster

The leader of the Pack meeting is the Cubmaster. In addition to serving as the Master of Ceremonies the Cubmaster provides support to Den Leaders.

Den Leaders

An adult, usually a parent, serves as a Den Leader. They carry out the activities related to adventures as they are presented in the Cub Scout's handbook and the Den Leader Guide.

Monthly Pack Meetings

Pack Meetings are where all the Dens come together for announcements of upcoming events & Rank Achievement Awards for the Scouts.

Pack meetings will be held on the 4th Tuesday of each month. If a Holiday falls in the 4^{th} week of the month (Thanksgiving or Christmas), the pack meeting will be held on the 3^{rd} Tuesday. If there is a 5th Tuesday in the month there can be a special outing or an event.

To register with the Boy Scouts of America (BSA)

Online registration is the preferred method to minimize lost paperwork & payments. Memberships are renewed each year on your registration anniversary.

Pack Dues

Pack dues cover neckerchief and slide; awards & patches; and supplies for the Pinewood Derby & Space Derby. Pack Dues are paid directly to the Pack.

PACK TOTAL: \$100

The Pack parents and Committee review the budget each year prior to the start of the meetings in September.

Badges, Patches, and Loops

Bobcat Badge

The first badge the Scouts will earn (except Lions) is the Bobcat rank regardless of age. The requirements can be found in the handbook or at: http://usscouts.org/advance/cubscout/bobcat.asp

- 1. Learn and say the Scout Oath, with help if needed.
- 2. Learn and say the Scout Law, with help if needed.
- 3. Show the Cub Scout sign. Tell what it means.
- 4. Show the Cub Scout handshake. Tell what it means.
- 5. Say the Cub Scout motto. Tell what it means.
- 6. Show the Cub Scout salute. Tell what it means.
- 7. With your parent or guardian, complete the exercises in the pamphlet *How to Protect Your Children From Child Abuse: A Parent's Guide*



This is something you can work on with your Scout & sign-off on their requirements when completed. Wolfs & above will also need the signature of their Den Leader.

Rank Badges

Cub Scouts will work with their Den to complete the required advancements for each rank depending on their grade level. Once the Rank has been completed, they will be presented with their Badge and a special face painting ceremony at the Pack Meeting.

Adventure Belt Loops

Adventures are the activities the Cub Scout completes with their Dens (or at home with their family). Once a Cub Scout completes an Adventure, they are awarded with an Adventure Belt Loop.

Patches

Patches are earned by participating in Pack Activities such as the Rain Gutter Regatta, Community Service Project, Pinewood Derby, Cub Scout Day Camp, and others.





Scouting is an All-Volunteer effort! Adult Leaders needed!

Adult Leader Training

Training for leaders is essential to provide consistent & quality leadership for our Scouts. Adult Leadership training helps to prepare Adult Leaders for what to expect in their Den & Pack. Adult Leadership training will also advise on how best to protect the Scouts as well as the leaders themselves. The BSA has one of the best training & literature libraries there is to be found. Some of the training can be taken online & at no fee at https://my.scouting.org

Please note that all adult volunteers will need to complete the Safeguarding our Youth Training available at this site. This takes about 90 minutes to watch the videos & answer the questions at the end of each video module. Additionally we recommend that all parents take SYT as well so that they can answer any questions their child has.

Leader Uniform

Leaders are strongly encouraged to wear uniforms whenever participating in Scouting events too. A Leader uniform consists of a Leader shirt with all required patches (World Crest, Unit Numerals 4571, & Chief Seattle Council Shoulder Patch). A Den Leader neckerchief & slide should be worn as an example to the Scouts in your Den.

Pack 4571 does not require a full head to toe Cub Scout uniform.

Our minimum uniform is:

- Neckerchief & slide (provided by the pack with the annual Pack Dues, no need to purchase)
- A rank appropriate Cub Scout or Webelos shirt**
- Patches for Uniform (World Crest, Unit Numerals 4571, and Chief Seattle Council shoulder patch)
- Cub Scout Belt (where adventure belt-loop awards can be displayed)**
- Rank appropriate Cap Optional

Uniforms are expected to be worn properly & with pride. Covered toe footwear is required (no sandals or Crocs) to all Pack sponsored events.

Rank appropriate handbook

A rank appropriate handbook is optional except for Webelos (4th & 5th Grades). Requirements can be found online for all ranks. The Den Leader will report advancement milestones to the Cubmaster & achievement awards will be awarded at a following Pack Meeting. Webelos Scouts will need to purchase a handbook to keep track of their advancements.

The Blue & Gold Banquet

The Blue & Gold is the annual birthday celebration of Cub Scouting (founded February 8, 1910).

Pinewood Derby

Pinewood Derby is probably our largest event of the year and typically occurs in March. Only official basic Pinewood Derby kits will be provided by the Pack.

Fundraisers

The money raised by fundraisers offsets the Pack Dues and allows Pack 4571 to provide a more enriching Scouting program for the Scouts.

Camping

Camping at the Cub Scout level is a family event. Scouts must be accompanied by a parent or guardian to participate. Campouts are typically during the Spring & Summer.

Cub Scout Day Camp

Cub Scout Day Camp is a District sponsored event which is held after school releases for the summer break. Dates, times, locations & prices will be announced later during the Scouting year. Day Camp is a wonderful opportunity for the Scouts to earn a lot of adventure belt-loops for their advancement.
