Cancellation policy for families

This is a public document

Mud Pie Explorers policies and procedures are working documents; therefore, they will be reviewed annually and when the need arises through changes to legislation or practice.

There will be occasions when cancellations are unavoidable, for us and our service users. The procedure sets out how we decide to cancel and how we deal with cancellations.

When families cancel a weekly class

Cancelling a space in a weekly class requires at least a month's notice via emailrachaelp@mud-pies.co.uk Even if a child does not attend the space needs to be paid for during the one-month notice period. This applies to spaces in a weekly group and 121 provision.

When a space is vacated mid month any sessions paid for within the monthly fee that take place after the notice period has ended will be refunded in line with the rates below.

Trial sessions are not refundable. Trials can be moved to an alternative date if required.

Refunds will be made to the card/ account that is used to pay fees. This can take up to 10 working days.

We pause payments for August each year and require a month's notice written of vacating a space.

Cancelling for safeguarding reasons

Mud Pie Explorers will cancel sessions if there is a potential risk to the safety of the children attending. Examples include:

- high winds speeds
- thunderstorms
- flooding
- other extreme weather

- children not being appropriately dressed for the session
- other unforeseen issues which mean it is not safe to run the session

As much notice as possible will be given of any cancellation. Refunds are not issued in these cases.

Other cancellations

Mud Pie Explorers may also need to cancel sessions if:

- There is staff illness/ injury
- Numbers of bookings do not cover costs
- There are other (non- safety) issues meaning the session can not run

As much notice as possible will be given of these types of cancellations. In these instances, a refund will be issued in line with the rates above. For children with 121 support you will not be invoiced for non-safeguarding related cancellations.
