Q: How do I get help changing my legal name and gender?

A: At this time we do not have any upcoming events or resources for the name and gender change process. Q: I need Gender Affirming Surgery and I can't travel outside of the Central Valley. What are my local options?

A: Dr. Julie Nicole (she/her) of the Central Valley OBGYN Medical Group (CVOMG) provides hysterectomies and HRT/TRT. Contact her office here:

Dr. Hardiman (she/her) at Fresno's Kaiser Permanente office provides top surgery for both transmasculine and transfeminine people. To see her, establish care with a Primary Care Physician (PCP) at any Kaiser Medical Office, and ask your PCP to submit a referral for top surgery services from Dr. Hardiman in Fresno. This referral may result in you receiving a phone call, telehealth appointment, or in-person appointment from a Kaiser counselor or nurse practitioner outside the valley, and these staff members—though it is their job to pair you with a competent specialist—are sometimes unaware that there are gender affirmation options in Fresno, so you may need to be the one to tell them about Dr. Hardiman and request to be assigned to her.

Q: I need Gender Affirming Hormones (HRT or TRT) and I can't travel outside of the Central Valley. What are my local options?

Most Planned Parenthood offices prescribe HRT/TRT and PrEP. Contact your local Planned Parenthood to find out if they accept your insurance or private payment.

Fresno State's Student Health and Counseling Center now offers HRT/TRT. Call 559-278-2734 or visit the clinic anytime between 8am and 4:45pm to schedule your appointment.

If you have insurance with Kaiser Permanente, send your Primary Care Physician an email requesting a referral to see one of the endocrinologists at the Fresno location for the purpose of receiving HRT/TRT for gender affirmation.

Q: Are you willing to be interviewed by, or provide a comment to, a news reporter or journalist?

A: As of 2025, we only speak with media or press organizations with inclusive hiring practices. Please have your organization's transgender, non-binary, Two-Spirit, or

gender-nonconforming reporter/journalist contact us and clarify up front how they are a member of the gender-diverse community. Even so, it may still be unlikely that we will respond to reporters/journalists due to our board members' overwhelmingly negative experiences with the press, the large number of interview requests we receive, the very limited time our two part-time staff members have for non-program related activities that do not increase our funding, and the large amount of hate mail we receive electronically every month from reporters/journalists specifically. Please note: hate messages, or threatening or bullying our board members into providing comments or interviews, will result in your contact info being permanently blocked.
