President Dobbertin called the meeting to order at 7:10 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance followed. Dobbertin announced the meeting was properly posted. Board members in attendance were Dobbertin, Imes, Lehman, Cotton and Andersen. District Administrator Russ was in attendance. There were no reporters and approximately 30 citizens in attendance.

Approval of Agenda

Motion by Lehman, second by Andersen to approve the agenda. Motion carried 5-0.

Approval of Minutes

Motion by Lehman, second by Andersen to approve board meeting minutes from Monday, February 26, 2024 @ 6:00 p.m., Open Session. Motion carried 5-0.

Information

Dr. Russ shared an update on Open Records requests. In the last month one request has been fulfilled. Estimated staff time over this period was 30 minutes for Jim Binney and an additional 40 mins for Dr. Russ.

Committee Reports

A. Facility Committee

Dr. Russ highlighted the Committee's work on the proposed facility and technology projects for the 2024-25 fiscal year. There was discussion about the 4 opportunities the district could explore if enrollment increases and our current space no longer meets the needs.

B. Policy/Personnel Committee

Dr. Russ spoke about the meeting on March 7th where there was a first reading of some 400 Series Policies.

C. Strategic Planning Committee

Dr. Russ indicated the Strategic Planning Committee met on March 5th and worked to identify the main priorities of the four main pillars of the possible Strategic Plan.

D. Negotiations Committee

Dr. Russ highlighted the meeting on March 14th with the Negotiations Committee and the Arrowhead Unified Teacher's Organization where a tentative agreement was reached. The proposal included a 3% increase to base wages along with a one time retention bonus for returning teacher's of \$1000.

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E. Student Achievement Committee

Dr. Russ indicated the Committee met just prior to the Board meeting and Maria Kucharski gave the Committee an update on Act 20. She also let the Board know that they could expect an April proposal for a new ELA curriculum.

New Business

A. Continued Discussion about potential topics about 6th-8th Grade Social Emotional Learning and Academic and Career Planning (Possible Action)

Intermediate School Principal Steve Newcomer presented the information the Board requested from the February meeting. The Board asked the administration to survey our current families to see why they are opting out of the current Social Emotional Programming and what they might want to see in a new possible course. Principal Newcomer indicated there were several reasons parents identified in the survey. Motion by Andersen, second Lehman to have 6th-8th grade families option their child into the Second Step Curriculum during the registration process. Motion carried 5-0.

Motion by Andersen, second by Lehman to rescind the SEL motion made on August 8, 2022. Motion carried 5-0.

B. Discussion about how the District can build trust with all stakeholders (Discussion)

Rebecca Imes led a discussion on how to build trust with all stakeholders based on survey data the district received. Topics discussed included a quarterly board communication summary and board transparency. There was also discussion about bringing back whole community communication mailers. There was a consensus that to build trust with staff that the current model of meet and confer seemed to be met with positivity and perhaps there could be more of these held in the future.

Motion by Cotton, second by Imes to approve the proposed Employee Handbook Language surrounding personal time off to be effective July 1, 2024. Motion carried 5-0.

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E. Approval of E-Rate (Technology) Project (Action)

Motion by Andersen, second by Cotton to approve 40 new hot spots proposed by COREBtS at the Intermediate School that would qualify for eRate reimbursement.

Motion carried 5-0.

F. Approve 2024-26 66.03 Agreement with Elmbrook Schools (Special Education Services) (Action)

Motion by Imes, second by Lehman to approve the 2024-26 66.03 Agreement with Elmbrook Schools for Deaf and Hard of Hearing services. Motion carried 5-0.
