Gresham Meggett Breakfast Reception

Thank you to Coach Hilyer and the 2nd-period U.S. History class for hosting a wonderful breakfast reception for Gresham Meggett alumni. Thank to Mayor Brook Lyon for attending.

As noted in the link below, Gresham Meggett High School opened in 1951 as the designated school for African American students on James Island. Coach Hilyer highlighted that the school was designed by the same architect responsible for the original James Island High School, which later became the old Camp Road Middle School before being demolished a few years ago. The two schools were intentionally designed to look the same to align with the "separate but equal" doctrine of the time.

Gresham Meggett closed in 1969 when schools were integrated, and one of the alumni in attendance was a member of the final graduating class in 1970. What an incredible opportunity to experience history firsthand!
