COURSE OBJECTIVES



Expose Students to Diverse Fields and Skills: Introduce students to various topics and professions, broadening their understanding and interests.

Foster Community Engagement: Connect students with local experts and community members, building relationships and networks.

Develop Practical Skills: Equip students with valuable skills and knowledge that can be applied in everyday life and future careers.

Promote Curiosity and Lifelong Learning: Inspire a love for learning and curiosity about the world through exposure to new and exciting subjects. Create a place to ask questions.

Enhance Critical Thinking and Problem-Solving: Encourage students to think critically and solve problems creatively through hands-on activities and discussions.

EXPECTATIONS AND ACCOMMODATIONS
