SRE- Scope and Sequence- Stage 1

Topics 1, 2 and 3: Introduction, Sikh Gurus & Gurudwara

Duration: 1 year

Content Focus: Students to learn how to greet in Punjabi. They will practise this in mock situations in class and in real life in the community. Once this has been accomplished, they will learn the names of the ten Gurus and complete activities in class to consolidate their understanding. These activities can consist of role plays, videos, poems and Gurudwara visits etc.

SRE- Scope and Sequence- Stage 2

Topics 4, -9 : Guru Granth Sahib, The concept of Akal Purakh, Panj Piaras, Four Sahibzadas, Sikh Life, Who is Sikh

Duration: 1 year

Content Focus: Students to learn who compiled the Guru Granth Sahib and its contributors its messages and their relevance to modern day society. They will also learn the concept of Akal Purakh, its meaning and importance. Students will gain an understanding of the Panj Piaras, their history and significance in society. As responsible young citizens of Australia, they will appreciate the role of Sikhs in society and value their role in it. Students will engage in role plays, group discussions, speech delivery, listening, reading and writing activities etc.

SRE- Scope and Sequence- Stage 3

Topics 10 -15: Establishment of Khalsa and other major historical Events, Four Kurahits, Social and Gender Equality, Sikh slogan and salutation , Celebrations and Ceremonies , Code Of Conduct

Duration: 1 year

Content Focus: Students to learn the role of the tenth Guru in the establishment of the Khalsa as well as other major historical events that followed it. They will then be able to make links to the learning from these events in their lives. Students will also learn that dishonesty, smoking, drinking and adultery are four kurahits in Sikhism. They will appreciate gender and social equality in their household and in the wider community. Students will use the Sikh slogan and salutation in daily communication especially when conversing with people from the Sikh religion or background. The importance of religious celebrations and ceremonies will also be covered. Students will understand the Rehat Maryada as prescribed in religious texts.
