Student Program Descriptions

<u>Program</u>	<u>Description</u>
"Finding Your Best Fit"	Students will research colleges/universities as well as academic programs that align with their personal preferences and ambitions. They will use Naviance to compile a list of suitable colleges, ensuring readiness for the application process.
College Application Workshop	Students will engage in completing the Common Application and/or Coalition Application, along with individual school applications, receiving guidance and support from school counselors throughout the process.
College Essay Writing Workshop	Students will be instructed in various techniques and strategies for crafting diverse types of college application essays. With the guidance of school counselors and English teachers, students will receive assistance in generating essay topics and commencing their writing process. They will be allotted time to draft their essays and will have the opportunity to meet with a teacher or counselor for feedback on their drafts.
Student Priority Work Session	Students will be allotted free time to focus on any aspect of the post-secondary process where they require the most assistance and support.
