In my view the best way forward is to offer everyone — renters, homeowners, old-timers and newcomers — a voice and an opportunity to become involved.

Why should we vote for you?

Our next step is to translate those values statements into concrete actions and policies so that our efforts truly reflect who we aspire to be. To be successful, we must continue our work to make SMILE accessible, inclusive and equitable for all of our residents.

We are so fortunate that neighborhood volunteers from decades past had the foresight to procure the SMILE Station, save the Sellwood Community House, create a revenue stream that supports neighborhood activities, and amass a healthy rainy day fund. We must honor those volunteers by managing our

resources so that Sellwood-Moreland residents can enjoy them for years to come. I see this as the highest responsibility of the SMILE Board.
