- 2. Approve Event, Parade, and Street Closure Requests
 - a. Building Use Request New Paltz International Exchange Committee, for Wednesday, March 20, 2024. The committee requests a waiver of insurance for this meeting with the Sister City Committee, to planfor the arrival of a delegation from Niimi City this Spring.

 - b. Approve DPW request to renew contract with Fischer Security & Electric Systems for upgraded alarms at the Rte 32, Orchard Lane and Henry Court pump stations, in the amount of \$2,475.00.
 - c. Google Renewal Quote from Suitebriar: 21 users at \$12/month per user = \$3,024.
 - *Approve DPW request for permission to conduct emergency repairs to trickling filter one and two at the Wastewater Treatment Plant, necessary to conform with the NYS DEC notice of violation.
 - i. *The lowest estimate for the WWTP Trickling Filter Rehab Replacement Project was supplied by Coppola Associates in the amount of \$82,000.
 - *The grit chamber parts cost is \$11,389.80. The Vendor is Jedonna LLC of Derby, CT.
 - e. *Approve Change Order #2 for the Wallkill Valley Rail Trail Connection Project to Henry W. Dubois (Empire State Trail), submitted by Alta Planning for work to be completed by Green Meadows Enterprises, in the amount of \$15,075. This field change incorporates revisions to the work within the NYSDOT Right-of-Way as per comments received from the Department on the highway work permit application. This project is being funded by Hudson Valley Greenway via reimbursement to VoNP.
 - f. *Approve Change Order #4 for Contract VNP-231 (Consent Order Compliance Sewer Remediation). Change Order #4 increases the Contract Amount by \$47,119.32, for additional work performed by Amity's subcontractor, Arold Construction, for sewer rehabilitation work on Huguenot Street (refer to Change Order #4 narrative and supporting documents). The subcontractor encountered conditions that required rehabilitation methods beyond the scope of the contract (i.e., heavy cleaning of cast iron pipe, and supplementary bypass operations), and was also requested to perform additional activities to facilitate the contract work (removal of debris and sediment in downstream sewers that were causing surcharging of sewers in the work area).
- Appoint Nikki Koenig Nielson as an alternate member of the Planning Board.

 - a. Representative from Spectrum said they will retrieve data that shows how many viewers there have been for Channel 23 certain periods of time (1 hour, 5 hours, etc.) per month.
 - b. Decline is Public Access Channel 23 watchers? The second payment of FY 2024's Cable TV franchise fee was made recently. At \$27,203, this represents a (36%) decline in revenue for the Village since \$42,683 was received in 2013. This source of revenue for our local government has been declining annually. The decline may be more significant if one were also factoring in any Cable TV cost increases. Via the Federal Cable Act, municipalities, like the Village of New Paltz, are entitled to a percentage of gross revenues from cable TV operators who place their facilities in the public right-of-way. However, there is no franchise fee for online TV streaming services that use the same public right-of-way.
