IMPERIALISM MAPTIVITY

Purpose

Empires are nothing new—they've been around in one form or another for thousands of years. However, from 1750 to 1914, the nature of empire was transformed through industrialization. In this mapping exercise you will identify some of the most powerful states practicing this new industrialized imperialism, and use political maps to evaluate change over time.

Process

1. On your paper, jot down some of the major transformations you learned about in Unit 5. Be sure to note which regions and/or countries primarily experienced these changes.

2. Access the two political maps: <u>1750 CE Political Map</u> and <u>1914 CE Political Map</u>. If you are using the maps digitally, be sure to check out the zoom feature to get a closer look!
