## K-2 Examples

### Science: Life Cycles of Animals

- Main Idea: Life cycle of a butterfly
- **Key Details:** Stages—egg, caterpillar, chrysalis, butterfly
- **Examples:** Drawing each stage, labeling metamorphosis
- Takeaways: Understanding growth and change in nature

#### Social Studies: Texas Symbols

- Main Idea: Important symbols of Texas
- Key Details: State flag, bluebonnet, longhorn, Alamo
- **Examples:** Drawing each symbol, explaining its importance
- Takeaways: Recognizing state pride and cultural identity

## 3-5 Examples

### Science: Renewable vs. Nonrenewable Resources

- Main Idea: Types of natural resources
- Key Details: Renewable—solar, wind; Non Renewable—coal, oil
- **Examples:** Comparing energy sources, real-world examples
- Takeaways: The impact of resource use on the environment

#### Social Studies: Texas Revolution

- Main Idea: Causes and outcomes of the Texas Revolution
- **Key Details:** Key events—Battle of Gonzales, Alamo, San Jacinto
- Examples: Leaders like Sam Houston, significance of independence
- Takeaways: How Texas became a republic and later a state

### 6-8 Examples

### Science: The Water Cycle

- Main Idea: Stages of the water cycle
- **Key Details:** Evaporation, condensation, precipitation, collection

- **Examples:** Drawing the cycle, real-life examples like rain and rivers
- Takeaways: Water's movement through Earth's systems

### Social Studies: Civil War's Impact on Texas

- Main Idea: Texas during the Civil War
- **Key Details:** Secession, economy, battles in Texas
- **Examples:** Texas leaders, impact on plantations and trade
- Takeaways: How war shaped Texas history and economy

# 9-12 Examples

#### Science: Newton's Laws of Motion

- Main Idea: Newton's three laws of motion
- Key Details: Inertia, force/mass/acceleration, action/reaction
- **Examples:** Car crashes (1st law), rockets (3rd law)
- Takeaways: How physics explains movement in everyday life

### **Social Studies: The Texas Economy**

- Main Idea: Key industries driving Texas' economy
- Key Details: Oil, technology, agriculture, trade
- Examples: How oil booms shaped Texas, major corporations
- Takeaways: Why Texas is an economic powerhouse
