This week's Parsha

This week the parsha is Noach. Noach is famous for its title character, Noah, and his ark. There is a lesser discussed aspect to this Parsha though. After the building of the ark and the bringing of the flood and the finding of dry land, there is the story of the tower of Babel.

We read the following two passages in this week's parsha:

"And God blessed Noah and his sons, and said to them: "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth." Genesis 9:1

"Now the entire earth was of one language and uniform words. And it came to pass when they traveled from the East, that they found a valley in the Land of Shinar and settled there." Genesis 11: 1-2

Immediately following the great flood, God blesses Noah and instructs him to "fill the earth." What actually happens is that the entire population "found a valley in the land of Shinar and settled there." The people were starting to exhibit the same behavior that made God cause the flood in the first place. The only difference between the two instances is that God has already promised to not cause a flood and destroy mankind. Instead, God decided the best course of action would be to force the people to spread out all over the world. God causes the population of this valley to speak different languages and all of a sudden no one can understand each other.

This week's parsha teaches us a very important lesson. There are many things that divide us and keep us apart but there was a time that we all lived together and shared a common language. Through the universal language of acts of compassion and kindness we can bring ourselves closer together even if we don't understand what the other person is saying.

Language Arts Mrs. Manos	Vocabulary: fiction, capital, upper case lower case, five senses, graph Writing: We are writing about our five senses. What do we hear, smell, touch, taste, see in the Autumn? Reading: We are reading about apples, Autumn, and Counting! Judaic Studies Morah Solomon & Morah Becca	students will be able to count them and record the number of objects in each set using a picture graph. This week the kindergarteners have been very busy working on their sequential Big Book of Creation. We are also decorating the classroom with "community" projects for the Creation story. Science Mr. Abelson	Kindergarten students looked at leaves and their changing color. Students collected leaves from the Biblical Garden and prepared them for chromatography.
