## Cousins or Friends? Lion King Secrets

King of the jungle? Some people think they live in the jungle, but that is just not true. Savannas, scrubland, grasslands, and rocky hills, yes. You might know them for their beautiful long manes, or their loud roar, or their presence in the food chain. Some may call it a giant house cat. This special animal is a lion. Nala then ran away from Pride Rock to find help and found Simba (Quintana). Nala rejecting Scar affected how the movie played out.
