HOW HOLY SPIRIT COMFORT US, GUIDE US TO THE TRUTH , GIVE US STRENGHT

The Holy Spirit not only guides us but also can give us comfort in times of trials. Trials come to every mortal being at different times in life. People all over the world, within our own communities, and in our own homes experience trials and tribulations.

The Holy Spirit who Jesus said would abide with us forever is our Comforter. He is here to be to us everything Jesus was to His disciples when He was here present with them. The Holy Spirit truly fills in for Jesus, doing what He would be doing if He was physically present. He kept them on the right path for the 3 ½ years that He was with them. The Holy Spirit will be with us forever and He also will keep us from the evils of this world. That is why we need to know how to walk in fellowship or communion with the Holy Spirit (2 Cor. 13:14).

As the Comforter He comes alongside us to pick us up by speaking tenderly to us and in a way that soothes our pain like a medicine. He does this by:

1. Communicating joy Rm. 14:17; (2 Thess. 1:6)

Romans 14:17 For the kingdom of God is not meat and drink; but righteousness, and peace, and joy in the Holy Ghost.

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2. Soothes us by sharing God's love for us Rm. 5:5, 8; (2 Cor. 13:14).

Romans 5:5 And hope maketh not ashamed; because the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us.

3. Teaching and leading us to the truth of God's Word that we need John 14:26; (John 16:13 He points out what we don't know or did know but forgot).

John 14:26 But the Comforter, which is the Holy Ghost, whom the Father will send in my name, he shall teach you all things, and bring all things to your remembrance, whatsoever I have said unto you.

4. Imparts hope in an abounding measure by His power Rm. 15:13.

Romans 15:13 Now the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, that ye may abound in hope, through the power of the Holy Ghost.

5. Brings forth anointing that removes burdens and destroys yokes of bondage Is. 61:1-3.

THE HOLY SPIRIT MAKES US FAITHFUL DISCIPLES

The only spirit make us a faithful disciple of Jesus Christ. Using Stephen as a practical example. He was a deacon at the church in Jerusalem. He was full of the Holy Spirit, he performed remarkable miracles. He preached the word of God to the Jews. While he preached some people from the other synagogues hated Stephen because he always speak the truth. So they secretly stir up men against him saying that he spoke disrespectful words against Moses and God. This make the people angry both the scribes and the elders.

They took Stephen to the council and set up false witnesses against him. Yet he was not afraid because he was filled with the Holy Spirit.

When he look up to heaven he saw the glory of God and Jesus standing at the right hand of God. He told the people what he saw, they took him out of the city and stoned him to death. Even as they were stoning him he prayed with a loud voice that the lord should not hold their sin against them. Stephen was faithful to the Gospel of Christ even at death point.

THE HOLY SPIRIT GUIDE OUR TALENTS PROPERLY

The Holy Spirit guides us to use our talent properly. God will not be happy if we mis- use our talent.

Using the parable of Jesus Christ. A Master was going on a journey before he left for the journey he told his three servant to take care of his property and he gave five talent to one, two talents to the second servant and one talent to the third servant. When a returned after a long time. He asked the servant how they have used the talent he gave to them before leaving.

The first servant who have five talent have gained five more talent, The second servant he gave two talent had also gained two more, The third servant who had only one talent did not use the talent for anything, so he didn't gained anything. The master was angry with the third servant and collected the talent and gave it to the one with ten talent. The one that did not use his talent was called unfaithful servant and was thrown out of his master palace.

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This shows that we need the Holy Spirit so that he will guide us to make effective use of our talent else our talent will be taken from us.
