

Checklist of reforms for a single European law covering full political rights for 14 million mobile EU citizens

1. Create a system for *sharing complete data* and statistics on turnout and registration of mobile EU citizens and research for more efficient policy design.
2. Carry out general *awareness* raising campaigns as a clear obligation for the EU and all Member States to encourage EU citizens to exercise their right to vote.
3. The establishment of a further duty for Member States *to inform* EU citizens individually and in their own language of their voting rights and eligibility.
4. *Automatic registration* in the country of residence to increase turnout provided the option of voting in one's country of origin is safeguarded.
5. Create a *help desk* to provide advice about procedures for voting or standing in one's country of residence or back home and for overcoming the obstacles, whilst combating fraud and double voting.
6. Encourage sharing of best practice to make *e-voting or postal voting* easier and safer, whilst spreading reforms to introduce more choice as to when and where to vote, taking into account lessons from the COVID-19 impact.
7. Use *innovative methods* and support action by civil society to reach out to EU citizens and to *minority groups*, in order to involve them in the democratic process.
