Halloween Costumes

Students are invited to show their Golden Eagles Spirit for our Halloween Spirit Week. We recognize that the countdown is on for parents to find the perfect Halloween costume for their children. As tempting as it may be to dress our kids in pretty much anything they want to be, it is important to consider a more thoughtful approach to whether the costume is appropriate and culturally sensitive. On Friday, October 31, "Wear your Costumes or "Orange & Black" Day, please ensure costumes are: not too scary, should not depict violence or other inappropriate messages in keeping with our OCSB Code of Conduct, and should not be offensive in any way. Costumes that could be offensive or perpetuate a stereotype of someone's culture, gender, heritage, or religion are not permitted. Students are asked to leave accessories (i.e., plastic weapons) or masks at home and should be sure they are comfortable wearing their costumes all day. As always, the school is not responsible for lost or damaged items. Inflatable costumes are not recommended.

According to the Cambridge Dictionary, cultural appropriation is, "the act of taking or using things from a culture that is not your own, especially without showing that you understand or respect the culture." Halloween is a fun event and with some creativity and imagination, parents/guardians can help their child(ren) with deciding on a costume that aligns with a culturally sensitive Halloween. It is everyone's responsibility to create a safe environment for all students and help students understand how costume choices may impact others in the building. Being proactive can help us to avoid uncomfortable

situations at school and in our community and can help us ensure that Halloween is a fun event where all students feel safe and honoured.

We ask that you <u>do not send</u> treats to share with the class. Many classes will do some Halloween-themed activities. Thank you for your cooperation.
