
- Story Map (November 17)
 - Will evaluate how to get to SNAP retailers, primarily grocery stores, maybe convenience.
 - We would have a pre nutrition survey
 - The intro into the story map would be a snapshot view of Wake, evaluating demographic data.
 - Looking into barriers families and communities in Wake might face when trying to get/access food
 - Pictures of SNAP retailers looking at the type of foods they offer may prepare a My Plate to see that you cannot get a proper meal (They can create their My Plate to evaluate if they can provide the correct nutrients properly).
 - A transportation section, can people get to these SNAP retailers?
 - How did we get here?
 - The decision-making process to get to the point where we are at
 - Where would we make recommendations
 - Community awareness
 - Hubs around the community and are they doing community-level delivery
 - Map out; these are the communities- where is the overlap, do they have access

- I have a spreadsheet with all of the SNAP retailers in Wake County
 - I am organizing them into different categories whether it is grocery, convenience, variety, banking/tax, etc.
 - This data was added to a story map and filtered down to just grocery stores

- Developed a survey to ask people at different Wake County hubs about their access to grocery stores.
