Innovating and Intervening Accomplishments

1. Significant Accomplishments in Fostering Learning

Project ELITE (Elevate Learning through Interactive Teaching Empowerment)

Project/Work Accomplished

Last December 18, 2020, during the conduct of the In-Service Training at La Huerta Elementary School via Google Meet, Ma'am Rafaela Santander laid all the cards presenting how ELITE (Elevate Learning through Interactive Teaching Empowerment) aced its implementation.

The following were the accomplishment with flying colors despite the threat of Covid-19 for the year 2020:



Seminars for teachers

All throughout the strike of Covid-19, the Department of Education has shielded teachers with enough seminars and training to protect the educational system. In spite of delays in going back to school, teachers continuously equipped themselves with proper learnings and adapted to the new normal of providing knowledge to learners starting April of 2020. Up until today those classes have been resumed; teachers attend seminars for the advancement of instruction provided by DEPED Paranaque.

Laptops for Teachers

To work efficiently and effectively, a great number of LHES teachers were given laptops across grade levels last September 2020 to be used for school-related matters. Teachers were beyond thankful for receiving their gadgets because they will be able to do their task with ease in the new normal of teaching. Next batch of laptops will be next in line to be provided to remaining teachers that need advanced devices.

Tablet for Learners

What is more delightful than having individual tablets for pupils for the continuation of learning in this era of pandemic. Kindergarten and Grade 1 pupils received their gadgets last December, 2020 wherein modules and reading materials were installed. It will be easier to study at home with this advanced style of teaching and learning.

Learning Programs provided

LHES has engaged on different Learning Programs such as My On and Technokids as engaging online activities that learners can use for their improvement in education. Selected teachers were trained to perfection to excellently impart knowledge to parents and pupils on how these programs work.

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Access Points for better connection

This January of 2021, La Huerta Elementary School has been granted 2 Access points in school to better provide internet connections for teachers and pupils' benefit. It is installed on different parts of the school so that the range of connection will be on point. Thankful for this installation that will surely profit school's every learning individual.

Number of strategies / Activities done that have significantly influenced / provided greater impact in the performance of the of the school

Certificates for Advance Learning

Teachers attend training and seminars on different online learning platforms provided by the Department of Education to develop their skills in teaching pupils despite today's battle against coronavirus.

Survey on Readiness in Teaching Online Platforms



LHES educators were surveyed digitally to identify teachers' level of ability in teaching online, understanding of computer knowledge and making their digitized learning materials to provide intensive training to aid the need for improvement.

Access points installation

Installing 2 access points were provided at La Huerta Elementary School to fully grasp the connection needed to link learning in the easiest way possible to reach pupils and teachers.

Gadget Maintenance

Recipients of laptops and tablets were provided with instructions for preventive maintenance service for continuous usage of the gadgets. Teachers and parents were reminded to take good care of the devices up until the end of the school year to better deliver learning digitally.

National Greening Program (Gulayan sa Tahanan)

The Gulayan sa Tahanan as part of the GREEN SCHOOL Project of the AIP and SIP, significantly and greatly influenced parents/guardians, learners, teachers, non-teaching personnel and other stakeholders in its objectives of providing vegetable harvests from their backyards, vacant lots or in plastic containers. This also created a good culture of sustainable vegetable planting hobbies and habits amidst the disastrous COVID 19 pandemic. Where in spite of its great havoc brought about by this said catastrophe, the "Program" had/still materialized and came to being.

Persons involved or concern, like the project team leader and his members did their concerted efforts to help parents/guardians and other stakeholders be informed, oriented and trained thru demo/lecture in the processes, procedures and technical knowhow; instill in them the importance of vegetables in our daily intake/needs, food scarcity, alleviations, Supply and the like.

The school and some stakeholders distributed seeds to parents, teachers and non-teaching personnel in which said beneficiaries sowed and planted to their respective homes or backyards; thus, said produce were used to feed their children/family.

As a continuous and sustainable program, the Gulayan sa Paaralan/Tahanan Program, bagged a Gulayan sa Paaralan Program Finalist Certificate for Elementary Level. Indeed it's a fruitful indicator of collaboration and concerted efforts of all persons involved or concern for the said program.

The Gulayan sa Paaralan/Tahanan has evolved into a new program, now referred to as the 4Ps Gulayan sa Pamayanan, a pilot project/program of the Deped, DSWD, DA, the Office of the President and AGREA, an NGO.

The goal of which is to increase food security and nutrition among 4Ps households through immediate and appropriate services and interventions intended to provide additional



food sources. Aimed at 1. Capacitating the 4Ps households in acquiring knowledge and skills on urban gardening; 2. Introducing the use of aquaponics equipment and fabrication of the same; and 3. Assessing the outcome of complementing services on the livelihood and food security of 4Ps beneficiaries.

In this regard, the school through the school head and the focal person of this program together with other teachers involved, collaboratively and tirelessly worked hand-in-hand to make this make come through. We divided the plantable areas into four(4), and so with the 4Ps beneficiaries as co-members. Said beneficiaries chose their day of services respectively.

Next year (2022) is our planned full implementation of this program. Part of the products that will be generated from the garden will go to the feeding program of the school and some to the 4Ps beneficiaries.



2. Impact of Accomplishments in making learning happen

LEARNING CONTINUITY PLAN (LCP)

Scope

Since the occurrence of COVID 19 at the last quarter of 2019, SDO Paranaque started to collaborate and plan with supervisors and school heads in addressing the challenges in the basic education for the school year 2020-2021 through its Basic Education Learning Continuity Plan (BE-LCP) under DepEd Order No. 012, s. 2020.

Hence school heads of every school in Paranaque City together with their competent teachers sat together virtually to prepare the BE-LCP. It aims to safeguard the health, safety, and well-being of the learners, teachers, and personnel in the time of COVID-19, while finding ways for education to continue amidst the crisis. In particular, the BE-LCP has been planned with a permissible framework responsive to the "new normal," keeping in mind the mandate to support the right of every Filipino to quality education.

Replicability of the program/project/activity

In connection with this, the learning delivery modalities adopted by La Huerta Elementary School are Modular Distance Learning and sometimes, Online Distance Learning via FB Messenger or via Google Meet. Modular Distance Learning is a Self-Learning Module (SLM) based on the most essential learning competencies (MELCS) prepared by selected teachers and produced by SDO/schools prior to the opening of classes.

Number of people, office benefitted and transactions facilitated

Online learning is a distance learning in which the main elements include physical separation of teachers and pupils during instruction and the use of various technologies to facilitate pupil-teacher and pupil-pupil communication. In using the two distance learning modalities, teachers cannot get a 100% participation. They exhaust their means, like texting or calling or even home visitation (following the health standards and procedures) in order to reach those who cannot participate or unresponsive pupils.

LHES is confronted with different challenges like in dealing with learners under any of the modes of distance learning or blended learning who are not capable of learning independently, or who are not periodically supported by their parents or guardians, mass production of the needed teachers and learners' learning materials, and substantial and additional financial resources in order to meet the objectives of the BE-LCP. But these were all resolved with the constant communication with teachers and parents, utilization of SDO MOOE and the support from the LGU.



Level of attainment per identified performance indicator

Through the identified learning modality and ensuring the provision of necessary materials, 2,780 learners were able to continue their education via distance learning. Truly, the learning environment amidst the COVID-19 pandemic will be very different. Yet, LHES is hopeful that in spite of the various socio-economic situations of families which affect the delivery of learning support in the home, and the irregular needs of different learners, the BE-LCP could be the key to providing quality basic education which is accessible and responsive in the new **normal**.

PROFESSIONAL LEARNING COMMUNITY (PLC)

Scope

A. Summer INSET 2020

The 2020 Simultaneous School INSET held on June 8 to 11, 2020 was one of the preparations of the school spearheaded by the SDO Paranaque to help adapt the school community in the new normal brought about by pandemic. That in spite of hindrances the educational sector is still able to deliver and fulfill its mandates. From the SDO officials as it is cascaded to the school level, surely it benefitted the learners, parents, and other stakeholders.

The INSET covered vast discussion and presentations of essential topics such as R.A. 11496, DepEd initiatives, school learning continuity plan, implementing guidelines on school calendar and activities for school year 2020-2021, talk on the new normal such as health protocols, adjustment in dealing with stakeholders (online transactions -personal and work-related; online delivery of services – school and SDO level; online meetings and trainings, Online Learning and various social media/DepEd Platforms, the LRM portal, detailed discussion of the different FLOs and presentation/discussion of model learning resources.

Replicability of the program/project/activity

With the very satisfactory results of the program it is likely to be replicated in the upcoming INSET or other occasions zeroing on the updates in the DepEd initiatives, school learning continuity plan, best practices in the delivery of services during new normal and online learning processes, and other similar topics.

Number of people, office benefitted and transactions facilitated

It was facilitated by the principal, master teachers and other teachers who served as resource speakers. It was monitored by the CID Chief and District Supervisors assigned. There were 85 teachers, one mobile teacher, and one alive teacher.



Level of attainment per identified performance indicator

Based on the exit survey conducted, answered by the participants in the School INSET the level of attainment per identified performance indicator was highly satisfactory as the participants strongly agreed that these indicators were attained.

Scope

B. Mid-Year INSET 2020

The 5-day School – Based INSET was designed to strengthen teachers' professionalism and improve instructional competence in serving our learners to become globally competitive in the midst of the pandemic. This training was drawn to dispense quality education which will help improve the pupils' academic performance in the new normal following the culture of leniency, consideration, and flexibility. This is also the time when teachers will be updated with necessary knowledge and skills on the use of new platforms in distance learning. The topics discussed were carefully designed to Learning Continuity Plan, Dynamic Learning Program and Interdisciplinary to foster academic ease. The teacher-training was a combination of theory and practice to build both conceptual understanding skills in using strategies and techniques that will transform classrooms and schools into conducive learning environments. It will provide teachers with active learning experiences to help them practice and interact.

Replicability of the program/project/activity

Mid-year INSET 2020 was aligned in the Dum #366, s.2020. All topics were specified, measured, assured and attained. This was only followed up and monitored in the implementation of Interdisciplinary Integration among teachers to foster academic ease in our learners.

Number of people, office benefitted and transactions facilitated

It was facilitated by the principal, master teachers and other teachers who served as resource speakers. It was monitored by the CID Chief and District Supervisors assigned. There were 85 teachers, one mobile teacher, and one alive teacher.

Level of attainment per identified performance indicator

After attendance to these training, teachers are able to:

a. Designed learning experiences for learners.



- b. Acquired knowledge and understanding
- c. Fully equipped in facilitating learners through online teaching.

Project CALL Communication Assistance and Link to Learners

Scope:

The worldwide COVID 19 Pandemic has greatly affected everyone's life including both health and economic status. This event brought changes in how we usually conduct our way into what we refer now as the "NEW NORMAL"

The educational system is battling with challenges in terms of the delivery of instructions. The default learning mode this School Year is modular instructions as the most suitable approach that indeed fits our house profile.

La Huerta Elementary School Brigada Eskwela 2020 team realized the urgency and importance of making learning possible despite this situation and have come up with the Project **CALL**, *Communication*, *Assistance and Link to Learners*.

Replicability of the program/project/activity

LHES Project **CALL** is anchored with the Division Brigada Eskwela Drive to help those learners without gadgets and tapped some alumni to be able to be part of the said project.

In line with this, LHES Stakeholders' Convergence aims to be a tower of encouragement to be able to sustain quality education to 2870 learners coming from different socio-economic backgrounds.

Henceforth, collaboration, support, and commitment of education stakeholders especially the LHES Alumni, Barangay Officials, and other stakeholders are significant.

Relative to this, the new learning modality requires the use of cellular phones as a tool for communication to parents, guardians, and learners. Based on the survey made, 667 or 31% of learners do not have gadgets from 2151 enrolled in June.

Thus, Project **CALL** (**C**ommunication, **A**ssistance, and **L**ink to **L**earners) would be of great value for them to prosper under the new learning modality

Number of people, office benefitted, and transactions facilitated



Since Project **CALL** (*Communication, Assistance, and Link to Learners*) is the main highlight of Brigada Eskwela 2020, generous sponsors, alumni from different batches and other partners shared and donated 52 gadgets to 52 LHES learners particularly those who do not have any from Grades 2-6 levels. It is also through the initiative and effort of our hard working School Principal, Dr. Genie-Ann T. Santos and the full support of 84 teachers. There were 30 units of Brand New Android Tablet Phones and 22 units of Brand New Smart Phones being given to deserving beneficiaries to be able to cope with the daily interactions between a teacher and a parent/guardian as partners in the education of every learner. There were five batches of awarding of gadgets in support of the IATF Health and Safety Protocols Campaign to limit the number of individuals in school, avoid the spread of the virus and keep everyone safe.

Level of attainment per identified performance indicator

Indeed, Project **CALL** (*Communication, Assistance, and Link to Learners*) partly contributes to the attainment of making "*Learning Possible*" and achieves quality education in partnership with the parents of these 52 learners with commitment and cooperation.

Still, LHES Project **CALL** continues and hopes for stronger partnership and believes that every learner deserves good education that no learners will be left behind especially during this trying time.

3. Innovations in Enhancing Learners' Achievement

Project GREAT

(Gearing Reading Enhancement for Access to Tomorrow)

Project GREAT is a part of the three-year School Improvement Plan (SIP) 2020-2022 and included in the Annual Improvement Plan for fiscal year 2021. Project GREAT aims to reduce the high rate of frustration readers in 29% in English and 21% in Filipino to 0% in 3 years based on Phil-IRI GST and Oral Reading Test (SY 2019-2020); and to hone learners' reading skills using innovative and sustainable instructional reading materials (SY 2020-2021).

Despite the challenges in education caused by COVID 19, Project GREAT was able to accomplish the following activities:

1. Workshop in Creating Instructional Videos with Voice Over Using MS Power Point for Teachers (September 11, 2020)

English and Filipino teachers undergone a workshop in creating innovative and sustainable instructional reading materials via Google Meet. The workshop contained the use of adding different animations and adding voice over in Microsoft PowerPoint 2019.



2. Training Session for Parents about Strategies in Teaching Reading (November 20, 2020)

Parents and teachers attended an online training session about strategies in teaching reading via Google Meet. From the original webinar session from Vibal by Ms. Juliese Cerise Bulanadi, the online training discussed the importance of reading, factors that affect reading, and focused on how parents can teach reading to their children. A recorded video of the session was forward to those who have weak internet connection and were not able to attend due to their work.

3. Use of MyOn

Sponsored by the Local School Board, 600 learners of La Huerta Elementary School will be able to access the MyOn application, a student-centered, personalized literacy environment that gives students access to more than 6,000 enhanced digital books. It has close-reading tools, professionally recorded audio, and a built-in dictionary that will help deepen students' engagement—and unlock even greater reading growth.

4. Partnership with AHA! Learning Center

Kinder to Grade 2 learners and struggling readers from other grade levels will participate in the remedial and enrichment program of AHA! Learning Center. It is a project of Commodore Jose Francisco Foundation that serves public schools and communities with its free after-school programs and continues its mission in times of COVID through its project Eskwelang Pamilya.

PROJECT PLAY AP (Preceptors and Learners' Advocacy for best Yield in Araling Panlipunan)

PLAY AP is one of the flagship projects of the three years School Improvement Plan (SIP) 2020 - 2022 and included in the Annual Improvement Plan for fiscal year 2020. This project was not fully implemented because of the challenges brought about by Pandemic COVID 19, where teachers and learners did not undergo the traditional classroom set-up and classes were just opened last October 5, 2020.

Here are the objectives of Project PLAY AP:

- Ø To increase MPS IN Araling Panlipunan and GPA's of pupils
- Ø To improve teachers' instructional competence in teaching Araling Panlipunan through the use of high-technology learning materials resources.
- Ø To enable learners to actively participate in their learning environment in Araling Panlipunan through the use of high-technology teaching learning materials/ resources, School-Based Historical events celebration and Field trip;

In spite of the challenges, the PROJECT PLAY AP, was able to accomplish the following:



For Teachers:

Before the Pandemic or the New Normal only 14.29% or 6 out of 42 Araling Panlipunan teachers were competent, with strength competent and with Outstanding Strength on the use of digital technology/online platform on teaching-learning process. But because of frequent attending webinars or online seminar/workshop on the use of digital technology or online platform and continuous practice, there was an increase of 71.43% or 30 teachers are competent, with strength competent and with outstanding strength, (17 or .47% teachers are competent; 12 or 12.57% are with strength competent and 7 or 16.67% of Araling Panlipunan Teachers are with Outstanding Strength) on the use of digital technology/ online platform on teaching-learning process.

For Learners:

The Learners actively participated in the School Based Historical events celebration like:

United Nations' Day

During the celebration of United Nations' Day, the learners participated by creating flaglets and posting them on their window or doorsteps, by dressing up the National Costume of the country of their choice and by singing the United Nations' Song. Pupils/parents took video or pictures of all of their activities then posted them in the group chat.

Bonifacio Day

The school held a program to commemorate the birth of Andres Bonifacio via FB Live Streaming. Each grade had their presentation depicting the life of Andres Bonifacio showcasing the talent and versatility of selected pupils in poster making, poem recitation ("Pag-ibig sa Tinubuang Lupa" poem written by Bonifactio), and by dressing up portraying or look alike of Bonifacio as the Katipunero. The Teacher was able to show their expertise by showing these talents of pupils through video presentations.

Rizal's Death Anniversary

Same with the celebration of Bonifacio Day, the school held a program for Rizal's Death Anniversary. During the program, each grade level from Kinder to grade, rendered their presentation through video. The participants from the grade 1 recited the poem written by Rizal "Sa Aking mga Kababata". The Grade 2 pupils presented the Family Tree of Rizal, the Grade 3 did the Poster Making and Grade 4, Easy Writing, reflecting the life of Jose Rizal, Grade 5, reciting the poem "Huling Paalam," written by Rizal and the Grade 6, share the "Dokumentaryo sa Buhay ni Dr. Jose P. Rizal.



The Learners with the help of their parents collaboratively created a Diorama using recycled materials, were able to write sanaysay or an easy and make poster of some of the most significant topics of Araling Panlipunan in the first quarter,



DIGITAL ELLAN (EARLY LANGUAGE, LITERACY and NUMERACY PROGRAM)

In DepEd Order No.12 Series 2015, the Department of Education recognizes that the foundation of learning is a child's early Language, Literacy and Numeracy skills. These skills, according to DepEd do not develop naturally and these require careful planning and instruction; thus, there is a need for children to have access to age appropriate and culturally sensitive materials to help them develop the habits of reading, speaking, writing, and counting. ELLN Digital is a blended learning that supports early childhood development in language, literacy, and numeracy.

The SLAC Training on Early Language, Literacy and Numeracy Program for Primary Teachers from Kinder to Grade III Teachers was conducted and facilitated by the Master Teachers assigned in every Grade Level. The main goal of this training is to raise the achievement of our teachers in language, literacy, and numeracy through appropriate practices.

Indeed, this training has unpacked sufficient knowledge on every teacher. It was a fruitful and fun learning experience for every group of different levels of teachers. Teachers enjoyed and participated in every activity given during the training. They worked as a team to create instructional materials. Participants shared their ideas, experiences and knowledge that will help them in teaching.

The five prescribed modules with 13 lessons for ELLN were not accomplished completely due to the worldwide COVID-19 Pandemic. Only two sessions and an introduction of module 1 of ELLN Training was done. Succeeding sessions require actual class observation but due to this unexpected pandemic, training was postponed and will push through as soon as the situation gets better.

















Simulation on the Actual Usage of Printed and Digitized Self-learning Modules with Grade 4, 5 & 6 Guardians
