


Awesome Kidz 3

Unit 1 Lesson 16



Aim: Students will practice identifying and categorizing activities by cutting out pictures and gluing them under the correct days of the week.

Time: 45-60 minutes

Materials:

- Crayons
- Scissors and glue sticks
- Suggested AK "Days of the Week" Song: <https://englishhouse.mx/awesome-kidz-iii-songs>

Tip: Scaffold the cutting activity. For students who might struggle with cutting, provide pre-cut pictures or pair them with a buddy who can help. Alternatively, have an assistant or volunteer help with the cutting portion to ensure safety and success.

Engage:

Begin with the "Days of the Week" song.

Show a calendar with the day of the week, or draw it on the board, and ask students to help you name the days of the week, pointing to each day as they say it aloud.

Show flashcards with activities (e.g., swimming, painting, using a computer, playing an instrument, doing crafts, reading a book, sleeping). Ask students to name each activity as you point to the pictures (e.g., swimming, painting, using a computer, playing an instrument, doing crafts, reading a book, sleeping).

Explore & Practice:

Discuss what activities students do on different days of the week. For example, ask, "What do you do on Monday?" and let students share their responses. Show your own example on the

board: "On Monday, I swim. On Tuesday, I paint," etc. Draw it on the calendar or paste a flashcard.

With the Book

Show the lesson page and explain that today they will cut out pictures of different activities and glue them under the days of the week when they do those activities. Give clear instructions on how to safely cut out the pictures.

Walk around the classroom to assist and ensure students are cutting and gluing the pictures correctly.

Closing:

Have students share their completed work with a partner or in small groups, explaining which activities they do on which days.

Praise students for their hard work and participation.

Sing the "Days of the Week" song again to reinforce their learning.

Additional Activities

Class Schedule Chart

Create a large chart in the classroom with days of the week and common activities. Throughout the week, add activities to the chart as a class to reinforce the concept.

Interactive Calendar (optional)

Use an interactive calendar where students can place activity stickers or drawings under each day of the week.
