

Turkeys are a poultry type of bird, this means that they are part of the chicken family. Turkeys live in the wild forest, the open grassland and woodlands. Turkeys are not great flyers and live on the ground. They had an odd looking neck and head, which had bare skin with a pink, wattle which hangs under their beak and another piece, called a snoot, hangs over the top of their beak. They spend most of their time looking for seeds, nuts, grains, wild berries, insects, lizards, frogs and snails. They have many predators like snakes, crows, opossums, coyotes and more. The male turkeys attract the female turkeys by puffing up its chest and spreading its tail into a fan shape. The female lays a large number of eggs, from nine to twelve, sometimes even eighteen! Usually the older and bigger turkeys are dominant over the younger and smaller ones.
