Research Services Organization and Governance

The objective of this day's agenda is to identify if there are aspects related to the organization of research services that could be adapted to the context of the IPAB to enhance its services.

The session will begin with a presentation by the National Assembly of Benin, discussing their challenges and development needs regarding how the IPAB is organized and managed.

This will be followed by a moderated round table discussion to provide a comparative view of how services are organized, managed, staffed and funded by European partner parliaments, how they handle challenges, and what practices are most worth sharing or adapting with the National Assembly of Benin. Aiming for a mix of practice presentations and open discussions, the moderator will present a series of questions that would be answered by all colleagues, in order to provide a good overview of the practices. There will be three rounds of general questions and answers, followed by a 30-minute open discussion on the topic of the day.

At the end of the round table, the moderator will highlight some key ideas from the discussion.

The morning session will cover four main topics:

- Research services status, mission and fundamental values,
- How research services are funded and models for budget allocation and financial budget lines available for management for parliamentary research,
- Recruitment and retention and professional development frameworks for continuous learning,
- Processes for planning research services and products - annual planning and ad hoc responses to MP/committee requests

The afternoon session will explore what elements from the morning presentation are most relevant to the ANB and IPAB and if any practices could be adapted or developed. First the ANB delegation will

The session will begin with a presentation by the National Assembly of Benin, discussing their challenges and development needs regarding IPAB products, work processes and tools.</p> <p>This will be followed by a moderated round table discussions to provide a comparative exchange and dialogue about European Member State partner parliament's products, processes and tools, how they handle challenges, and what practices are most worth sharing or adapting with the National</p>		



Assembly of Benin. Aiming for a mix of practice presentations and open discussions, the moderator will present a series of questions that would be answered by all colleagues, in order to provide a good overview of the practices. There will be three rounds of general questions and answers, followed by a 30-minute open discussion on the topic of the day.

At the end of the round table, the moderator will highlight some key ideas from the discussion.

This theme will explore the various research products, the internal production processes, IT tools available, such as databases for managing research products and workflows and improving research tools and quality control. A session will be dedicated to exploring cases and practices for digital infrastructure implementation. **The morning session will cover four main topics:**

- Research Products and Standardization: Explore templates and quality standards for policy briefs, research notes, and other parliamentary products.
- Research and Analytical Methodologies: Discuss evidence-based frameworks and structured approaches to policy analysis.
- Research Management Systems: selecting, implementing, and managing digital tools for research storage, retrieval, and collaboration.
- Case studies on digital infrastructure implementation, and AI use: how have partner parliaments implemented digitalization and AI use, challenges, benefits, protocols

First the ANB delegation will brainstorm among themselves about what ideas are most interesting, present to the group, and then lead a discussion about what might jointly be done.

Day 3 Wednesday, December 3	Internal Coordination and Collaboration		
The objective of this day's agenda is to explore how parliaments handle internal coordination and collaboration and then to identify if there are aspects related internal collaboration that could be adapted to the context of the IPAB to enhance its services. The session will begin with a presentation by the National Assembly of Benin, discussing their challenges and development needs regarding internal coordination and collaboration.			
This will be followed by a moderated round table discussion to provide a comparative exchange and dialogue about European Member State partner parliament's internal coordination mechanisms, how they handle challenges, and what practices are worth sharing or adapting with the National Assembly of Benin. Aiming for a mix of practice presentations and open discussions, the moderator will present a series of questions that would be answered by all colleagues, in order to provide a good overview of the practices. There will be three rounds of general questions and answers, followed by a 30-minute open discussion on the topic of the day.			
At the end of the round table, the moderator will highlight some key ideas from the discussion.			
This theme examines the relationships and communication strategies between research services and other units within parliamentary support services, such as the legal service, committee secretariats, and the parliamentary library and archives. The goal is to identify best practices to enhance coordination and optimize parliamentarians' access to information.

<p>The objective of this day's agenda is to explore how parliaments handle cooperation with external partners, either international cooperation with other parliaments and parliamentary bodies, or collaboration with bodies and institutes external to parliament like ministries, think tanks, universities, civil society. It will explore how such collaboration can reinforce parliamentary research capacity.</p> <p>The session will begin with a presentation by the National Assembly of Benin, discussing their challenges and development needs regarding international cooperation and coordination with other bodies. This will be followed by a moderated round table discussion to provide a comparative exchange and dialogue about European Member State partner parliament's international</p>			

collaboration mechanisms and channels, and if they have practices that would be worth sharing or adapting with the National Assembly of Benin. Aiming for a mix of practice presentations and open discussions, the moderator will present a series of questions that would be answered by all colleagues, in order to provide a good overview of the practices. There will be three rounds of general questions and answers, followed by a 30-minute open discussion on the topic of the day.

At the end of the round table, the moderator will highlight some key ideas from the discussion.

This theme explores the interactions and cooperation efforts between research services and external stakeholders, including other parliaments, ministries, think tanks, universities, and NGOs. This topic will address approaches and collaborative arrangements that can strengthen the expertise and diversity of parliament's research work, and how international cooperation can reinforce the work of Parliament.

The themes for discussion are:

- Participation in regional and international parliamentary research networks.
- Protocols for accessing government information and building relationships with executive agencies.
- Engagement with civil society while maintaining research objectivity and non-partisanship.
- Establishing and maintaining partnerships with academic and research institutions.
- Knowledge exchange mechanisms and collaborative research initiatives.

The afternoon session will explore what elements from the morning presentation are most relevant to the ANB and IPAB and if any practices could be adapted or developed. First the ANB delegation will brainstorm among themselves about what ideas are most interesting, present to the group, and then lead a discussion about what might jointly be done.
