



2024 Call for Papers



The proposal submission deadline has passed and the Sunday Morning Papers Session committee has selected the speakers.

The Committee for Skeptical Inquiry is delighted to announce our annual Call for Papers. Selected applicants will have the opportunity to give a talk at the Sunday Morning Papers session of CSICon 2024. The conference will be held at the Horseshoe Casino in Las Vegas from October 24 - 27.

The tradition of the Sunday Morning Papers session recognizes new voices and new ideas, and showcases them on the CSICon stage. If you have had success in communicating scientific skepticism, combating pseudoscience, or furthering the mission of CSI in a significant way, we encourage you to submit a proposal.

If your proposal survives the initial selection process, you will be asked to submit a draft of your presentation slides, as well as a recording made with Zoom (or similar technology) of you doing a dry-run of your talk within the allotted time.

Following the final selection process (which may include an interview over Zoom) an invitation to participate in the Sunday Morning Papers Session will be extended to about 6 applicants. Those who accept the invitation will each be allocated approximately 15 minutes on the CSICon stage for their talk.



Selection Process Schedule

- Deadline for proposal submission: **May 3, 2024**
- Initial selection completed; request for further documentation: **May 17, 2024**
- Deadline for draft presentation and dry-run recording submission: **June 14, 2024**
- Final selection completed; invitations issued: **July 7, 2024**
- Deadline for accepting invitation (you must register for the conference prior to accepting the invitation): **July 12, 2024**



Relevant Topics

Appropriate topics for the CSiCon Sunday Morning Papers session are those which support the mission of the Committee for Skeptical Inquiry, and which reflect the type of material typically published in *Skeptical Inquirer*. 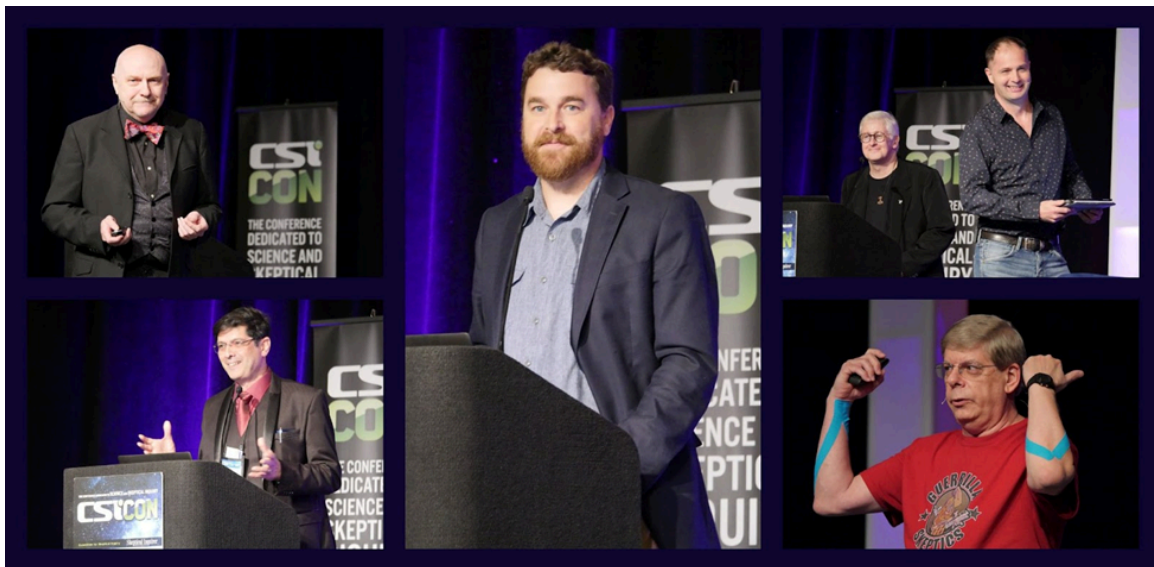

Submission Instructions

Please email your Sunday Morning Papers proposal in MS Word or pdf format to CSIConPapers@gmail.com. Please use the subject **Paper Proposal** and include the following information:

- Full name
- Position/Affiliation (optional)
- Email address
- Phone number
- Name of additional speaker (if any)
- Presentation title
- Abstract: Provide a concise summary of your proposed presentation in at least 150 words; you may use bullet points. A description of how the topic is relevant to the CSI mission must be included.
- References: Provide any relevant references related to your presentation, along with the associated weblinks if available.
