

## Title I School-Level Parent and Family Engagement Policy Hilltop Middle School 2021-22

2.1 With approval from the local governing board, *Hilltop Middle School* has developed a written Title I parent and family engagement policy with input from Title I parents and family members. ### 2.2 Involvement of Parents in the Title I Program

To involve parents and family members in the Title I program at Hilltop Middle School, the following practices have been established:
