Week 1

- Need more info to understand what all happens @ camp
- Online was terrible. At camp it was great. I hate tentaroo!
- Online horrible tentaroo sucks onsite was easy!

Week 2

- A little more difficult this b/c 1st year using tentaroo. I anticipate it going smooth next year
- Was great for not what to expect Easy for me, not involved w/turning in at camp
- On site worked well. All of the pre-arrival process is too time consuming for leaders, with multiple input processes and a breakdown between what was submitted and what the staff had at check in

Week 1

Week 2

Testing process was easy & efficient. Benches & area outside was very muddy. Pool & lake instruction went well. Changing rooms & "adult" showers could be better so that women's shower area is better. Pool shower extremely hot!

STEM

Week 1

STEM

- He had a great time. I love that parents could get involved. That was important to me

- My son had a great time & despite low scores (on evaluation), we were not disappointed & will return. I just think that the opportunity has not been fully realized to use/teach/more engineering , math, science, or technology.
- For the volume STEM exercise, use building blocks for younger campers. Easy to see why $L \times W \times H = V$.
- Science experiment were good on day one. Some activity need to be flexible for age of boys. BMX not sure what the STEM aspect was. Might want to tap into local resources for incorporations other idea for STEM
- More science could have been incorporated in the program. You could tap into the local community for volunteers in the STEM world to assist with designing the programs - or doing the presentations

Week 3

- I appreciate all of the staff's hard work I know it isn't always easy
- Have more age appropriate activities for the 5 + 6 year old groups. Day campers seemed to get forgotten for things. Make sure there are markers for the dens/camps @ dining hall.
- Camp organization better this year than last. Check-in went well, staggering check ins was a good idea. I liked how the day was organized with siesa after which and open camp before dinner. However, the leader meeting did not provide info regarding rules for campsite. No info on where to dump a full trash can, how to keep latrine clean. And info/rule sheet give to leaders and parents prior to arrival or @ check in would be extremely helpful. A clothesline @ campsite to hang wet towels & swim suits, lock box for snacks, more outlets for charging phones, wifi in dining pavilion.
- 1)Poison Ivy is so overgrown in many of the commonly-used areas and paths (eg from parade field to fitness) Would be nice to spray it occasionally, as I know many kids are going home w/ it unnecessarily! 2) Please check bathrooms more frequently. Both comfort

station and fitness facilities were out of TP by lunch. 3) BMX track must be better maintained. Badly eroded, needs to be raked, needs more dirt. Safety issue.

- Go back to Fri, Sat, & Sun please!
- Overall - excellent staff & experience but little things need attention
- Most of the adults and I could not hear any song /etc in the dining hall, except for pictures when the mic was used, maybe it was because of the # of people in camp. At your week 4 leaders meeting ask if anyone is having trouble understanding the songs. I bet it will be 8/10 nos. My son didn't really learn the songs b/c he could not hear. - Kids love Camp Mack and I do too. Best way to spend time off. Really got to see who my sons are.
- Need more staff members for activities in the lake and for fitness
- Rock climbing wall should be open more.
- Stop going to Bashore. The boys miss 2 hours of program for nothing. There needs to be built in info activities.
- Need something to keep cots on platforms. Archery + BB level 1 requirements/explanation was unnecessarily complicated. So many papers... Need more nylon tents w/screens.
- It is sad it is his last year, very emotional for mom. I personally hope to come back in future with my pack because the camp is amazing!
- OK to have day camp/weekend/weeklong campers all here at same time, however the day campers had 1 day "lost" in the check in/orientation process. They did no real activity that day.
- Outpost was disappointing - pre cooked chicken instead of making something seemed very disorganized. After free swim instead of 2nd campout would have been great. 1st 3 days fantastic, 2nd 3 days seemed unorganized and thrown together. Thank you all for putting this together for our boys!
