



The Uptake.org Data Fellows program is a six-month fellowship designed to connect data professionals at non-profits, foundations, and social enterprises all over the world to experts in data science and security. The fellowship begins with a week in Chicago where fellows meet with mentors, participate in workshops on topics in data science or security, and network with like-minded data-for-good professionals. The program now has two tracks: Data Science Fellows and Data Security Fellows (new!). Applications are due Friday, June 1.
