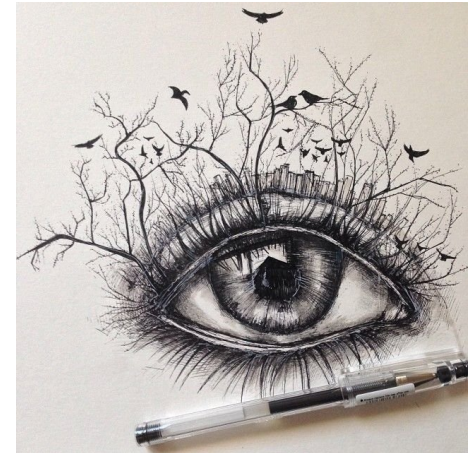

Draw/Paint 1 course description:

Students will explore new tools and techniques in drawing and painting in this intermediate-level class. Composition, the visual elements, the principles of design, and the basic techniques and concepts of both drawing and painting will be covered. The end goals are to increase artistic self-confidence, increase one's understanding of the basics of drawing /painting, and to produce successful works. Media used could be various pencils, pen and ink, charcoal, pastel, watercolor, tempera, acrylic, etc. Techniques covered could include contour, cross-hatching, blending, stipple, watercolor techniques, painting techniques, and others.

Grading:

Grading is based on a student's personal growth as well as an accumulation of project and participation-based points. Grading is based on an accumulation of summative and formative assignments.

30% summative

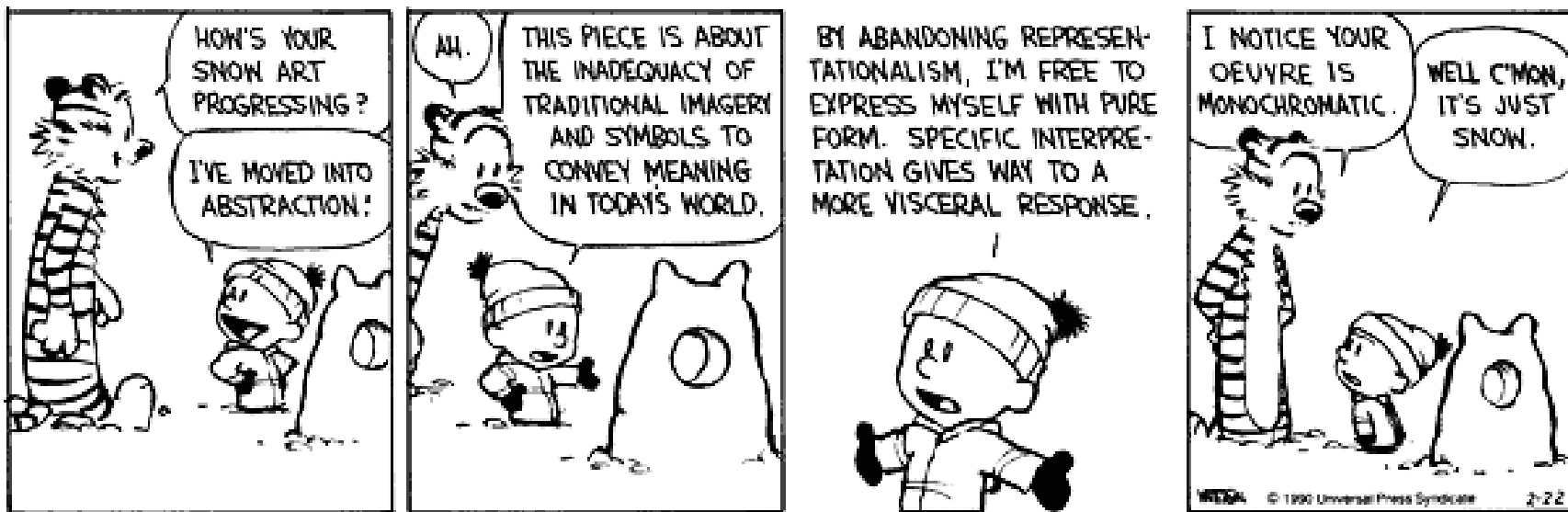
30% formative

To receive a passing grade the student must:

- Turn in all work complete and on time (name and date must appear clearly on all assignments).
- Come to class on time and prepared.
- Stay on task during class time.
- Use appropriate, responsible, respectful, and safe behavior: Students will be given one warning if behavior is inappropriate. If it continues, the student will be dismissed from class. Parents will receive a phone or e-mail message from the teacher. The student will be marked unexcused absent for the day.



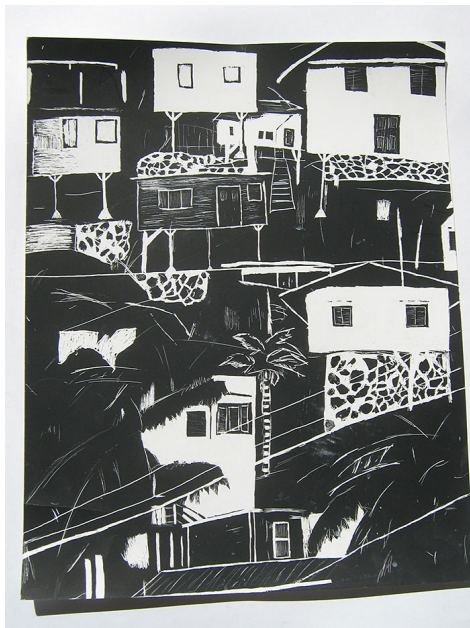

School Equipment:

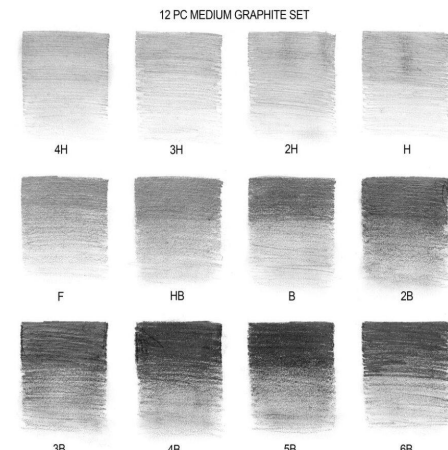
