Title: National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine Report on K-12 STEM Education and Workforce Development in Rural Areas

Description: There are numerous challenges to providing high quality STEM education and workforce development in rural areas.

Recognizing these challenges, the National Academies was directed to undertake a consensus study through the CHIPS+Science Act to take stock of existing federal programs that support rural STEM education and workforce development and to develop recommendations for federal, state, and local action to improve it.

The National Academies will undertake a consensus study to take stock of existing federal programs that support rural Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) education and workforce development, and to develop recommendations for federal, state, and local action to improve STEM education and workforce development in rural areas. For the purposes of this study, "workforce development" includes the interface with preK-12 learning opportunities, with a focus on the interface between postsecondary education institutions and high schools. Rural is defined broadly including population size, density and remoteness, and it may consider relative degrees of rurality (rather than only "rural" or "not rural"). Specifically, the committee will:

1. evaluates the quality and quantity of current federal programming and research directed at examining STEM education (in both formal and informal settings) for students in prekindergarten through grade 12 and workforce development in rural areas;


- 2. in coordination with the Federal Communications Commission, assesses the impact that the scarcity of broadband connectivity in rural communities, and the affordability of broadband connectivity, have on STEM and technical literacy for students in prekindergarten through grade 12 in rural areas;
- 3. assesses the core research and data needed to understand the challenges rural areas are facing in providing quality STEM education (in formal and informal settings) and workforce development, as well as the assets embedded in these communities;
- 4. makes recommendations for action at the federal, state, and local levels for improving STEM education, including online STEM education, for students in prekindergarten through grade 12 and workforce development in rural areas (whenever possible, findings and recommendations for preK-12 STEM education and workforce development in rural areas will be disaggregated to identify and address regional, racial/ethnic, and economic variability); and
- makes recommendations to inform the implementation of programs in sections 10512 ("National Science Foundation Rural STEM Activities") and 10513 ("Opportunities for Online Education"), which include the National Science Foundation's funding for rural STEM activities and online STEM education and mentoring in rural communities.



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Good morning Christi and Elliot, The ChED division had an Executive Committee meeting last week, and a
theme in our conversation was fear for our membership with regards to what are now, tragically and
unfortunately, very politically sensitive topics -- e.g., DEI.

In particular, we have members (including some students!) who do work in this area and are worried for their safety -- not just of their careers, but potentially of their actual person -- if there is a public record of any publications or awards related to these topics. While I know we all sincerely appreciate the statement that went out reinforcing ASEE's commitment to DEI, that does not mitigate the risk our authors may incur by publishing.

I know I would prefer that these members of our community still contribute and not simply withdraw their work. A couple of potential solutions that our Executive Committee tossed around include:

- Still require papers and posters to go through the formal review, but either:
- Allow the authors to remove their name and identifying information so that the publication can remain anonymous
- Allow the authors to still present the work without publishing the full paper
- If any authors receive awards related to DEI, approach them first to see if they are comfortable having such an award publicly acknowledged.

Regarding the first, I have been told by our senior members that ASEE was not always a publish-to-present conference -- I think it could be reasonable to make a couple of carefully chosen exceptions in these uncertain times.

Regarding the second, the American Institute of Chemical Engineers (AIChE) has already proposed a similar strategy, i.e., doing private awards ceremonies for DEI awards, and then allowing the awardee control over how the award is presented to the public.

At the end of the day, we are all engineers, so I believe we can solve this problem. I know we all care first and foremost about our community and continuation of the work we do. We appreciate anything ASEE can do regarding this matter.



- MP Additional P12 Representation The P12 representative positions are one year only. They are also usually not able to participate in the meeting calls. Do we think we need to have a different format in this area? There is such a diversity in P12 spaces across the US. Funding and time is also an issue for P12 reps to attend the conference. Can we bring more people into this space and help them with networking and increasing their voice and role with engineering education. We could add an additional PK-5 rep and an additional 6-12 rep. Or we could tease out middle school and create a 6-8 rep and a 9-12 rep. Could we involve pre-service teachers, especially if they are at a university that has an engineering education certification pathway? We should be nominating teachers who we work with. There has been a conversation around if engineering education is focused at a collegiate level that is supporting the P12 space or should there be a focus in the P12 space. What can we do to make sure that our higher ed colleagues are doing things in the best way for the P12 space? Putting together an ad hoc committee to talk through some of these things would be a good first step to determine if we need to change the bylaws

"Developing a K-16 Design Community of Practice: DEED/PCEE Panel Description: The purpose of this panel is to discuss the role that University Faculty and Students can play in supporting K-12 Pre College Education, specifically when it comes to design projects. The speakers in the panel will be college and university faculty who are experienced with either design or using design projects with pre-college engineering students. This panel will serve as a report out around a workshop taking place the Saturday before the National ASEE conference at the ASEE Commission for P12 Engineering Education (CP12) Teacher Conference event.

The workshop would invoke the Design Honeycomb as a basis for having teachers evaluate and expand their design based projects. The objective or outcome for the K-12 teachers is to give them some alternative forms or types of design related inquiry that they might incorporate in their classroom. During the workshop, the presenters seek to understand the barriers that K-12 teachers face when implementing design processes in the classroom. For the first year, the workshop focus will be on projects targeted at students in 6-8th grades.

The panel session would be during the regular conference and will be co-hosted by DEED.and PCEE. The panelists would present what they learned from the teachers in the workshop and lead a discussion with attendees. The objective with this is to start building connections among DEED and PCEE constituents toward building a more connected design community of practice.

Panel Set-up: The panel will consist of three main topics: • Introducing the panelists and allowing them to share how they got involved in K-12 outreach, and give an overview of what it means to serve as a faculty liaison for K-12 outreach. • What are the challenges from Design faculty perspectives in terms of sharing Engineering Design processes at a rigorous enough level but still targeting elementary school/middle school/ or high school students? • Reporting lessons learned from the workshop. Give questions from the workshop participants to the ASEE Design Community. • Giving advice and hearing from the community to start developing a design community of practice. Participants will be able to sign up to have their name listed on the DEED website if they would like to support schools.

Panel Format Requirement: A panel works best at allowing faculty who are interested in using their design knowledge to support future engineers. This panel format allows those who helped facilitate and participate in the CP12 workshop give a quick report out to the DEED and ASEE community.

- We should start a Legacy Stories feed. In the future, can we have a mentoring system for people who are new to the division?
- Be a bit more intentional with graduate students and knowing who/where they are as well as what is going on in teacher preparation = how are we reaching out to relevant stakeholders?
- Our membership is going down we were at approximately 800 members 5 years ago, so please help recruit members.
- Certification for PD costs \$500 where does that money go? This was a way to get ASEE in the precollege space with an endorsed credential. It is an intense process and half of the money went to the reviewers to compensate for their time. The other half was deposited into ASEE to support pre-college initiatives. ASEE is working to reduce some of those barriers. There are two programs that are credentialed (TeachEngineering and e4usa). It did not get marketed well and the price was too high so we only had the two programs go through the process. The list of reviewers is not public but they were people who were involved in the reviews. The list of reviewers should be made public as should where the money is going. This was a ASEE initiative with the P12 Commission. There were reviewers who were involved in PCEE but this was not a PCEE Division membership.
- THE PCEE/MIND/WIED social was in a ballroom with no food/drink let's try to revamp this and make sure there is food/drink next year. PCEE is only in charge every 3rd year. We will be in charge again in 2025.
- The K12 workshops were a mess this year why? That is moving over to the commission next year and they will take the lead.
- The whole idea of the commission was so that it was not a member responsibility to do everything and they are more broad because they need to think across the entire ASEE organization.
- What is the value for a K12 teacher to be a part of this organization? Maybe we can have a committee to identify what we can do to serve teachers at the conference next year.

Secretary/Treasurer (Becky) – ASEE held a town hall meeting on Feb 15th to provide updates on finances. ASEE had a \$5.7 million shortfall in September 2022 and the long term reserve was spent down close to zero without the board's knowledge. There is a forensic audit underway and the results will be shared when they are ready. ASEE has worked to pay back \$2.9 million but still owes roughly \$1.6 million to outside creditors. BASS account funds were all spent (\$1.1 million) to help pay down the debt. ASEE will honor what was in our BASS account but it will likely be multiple years before they can do that. Currently all funds raised by divisions after Oct

1, 2022 are being tracked separately and are available for use. We will not receive revenue from dues during this fiscal year and that amount will be added to what ASEE owes us. Patti can work with Divisions on social events for the conference on things like deposits but all social events must be revenue neutral.

PCEE Conference [Formerly called Teacher Workshop] Update- (From Andrea and Katey for Merredith): PCEE talked with the K12 Commission about partnering on the PCEE conference but did not go into details. This would bring in additional efforts from multiple divisions to the conference. It is currently in the idea phase.

Past Chair (From Andrea for Bradley) – Nine people have responded to call for election nominees. We still need a few more nominees for chair elect and program chair elect – please think about your current role and if you would be interested in one of these roles. If you are a past program chair, please consider running for chair elect.
