

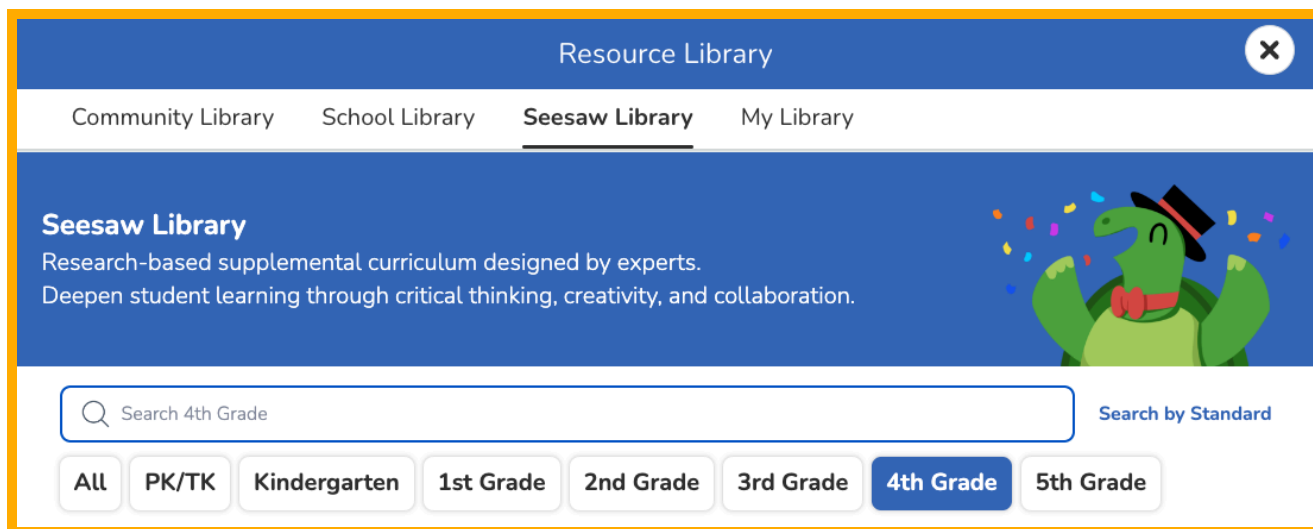
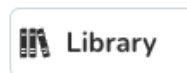

Teachers learn how to use the Seesaw Library to support student learning.

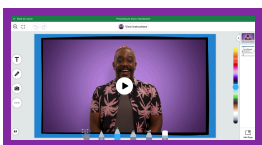
Access the Seesaw Library

All lessons include instructional content, multiple learning experiences, home-school-world connections, and opportunities for reflection and assessment.



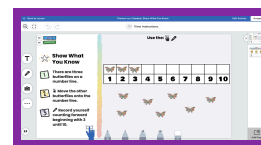
Instructional Content: Students build and activate background knowledge.

Home-School-World Connect: Extend learning by leveraging the home/community.

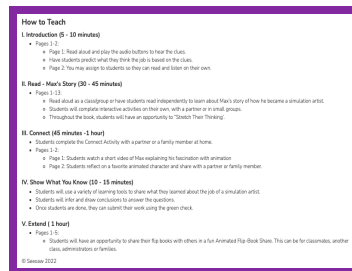
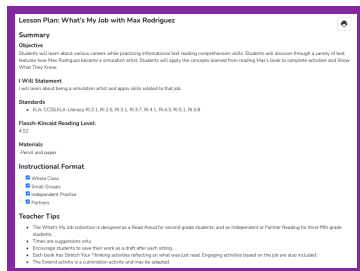


Reflection and Assessment: Teachers gain valuable insight into student learning.

The Lesson Plan

Every lesson has a detailed, printable Lesson Plan to help teachers successfully integrate lessons into their instructional routines.

Tap 'Jump To Lesson Plan' at the top of every Lesson to access it.



Integrate Lessons Into Instructional Routines

Lessons can be easily integrated into established instructional routines.



Whole Class: Play the instructional video or present the instructional content to reinforce or review concepts.



Centers or Stations: Differentiate for small groups, designate one or more Seesaw centers for students to complete a lesson.



Independent Practice: Assign a lesson that reinforces a whole class or small group taught skill.

Assign lessons to select students or groups of students to support differentiation, just tap 'Assign', 'Edit Students, Folders, Skills', and select 'Students & Groups'.
