Welcome to Design and Draw for Production!

What is Design and Draw for Production (DPP)?

Design and Draw for Production is a foundational course that will open the doors to either students pursuing engineering, architecture, or multimedia. This course combines creative elements with the technical aspects of problem solving, decision-making and critical thinking. Students are required to learn technical drawing, explore design techniques, paint, build 3D models, and become critically active in evaluating personal work and the work of others.

Units of Study:

Unit 1:Elements of Art

Unit Overview: Students will learn how to the elements of art play a role in the design process

Unit 2: Build Products

Unit Overview: Students will be able to bring their designs to life by using sculptural materials.

Unit 3:Color Theory

Unit Overview: Students will learn color schemes and how our eye perceive colors

Unit 4: 3D Models

Unit Overview: Students will be able to explore and create products they design using 3D pens and 3D printers.

Class Expectations:

 - Engaging in activities, self evaluating and reworking, and completing worksheets if given.
- Participation 15 %
 - Students take care of materials, putting in their best effort, managing their time, always prepared coming in and leaving class, constantly working, and handing in assignments on time.

Students are responsible for handing in work on the date set forth by the teacher. Each day the assignment is late, 5 points will be deducted.
