Mrs. Ingraham Dies at Age 89 In Manchester

MANCHESTER (Special) — Mrs. Eva W. Ingraham, 89, of 46 Starkweather St., mother of Vincent Ingraham, vice president of the Connecticut Bank and Trust Co., died Friday at Manchester Memorial Hospital after a long illness.

Born here Feb. 7, 1875, the daughter of the late Arthur and Mary Bidwell Wetherell, she had been a life-long resident of the town.

She was a member of Center Congregational Church; Sunset Rebekah Lodge, of which she was a past noble grand; member of Memorial Temple, Pythian Sisters and its Past Chief Club; member of Manchester Grange and for 18 years its chaplain, and member of Pomona State and the National Grange.

She leaves three other sons, Edward Ingraham of Devon, Ralph Ingraham of Citrus Hts., Calif., and William Ingraham of Foronoco, Mass.; two daughters, Mrs. Walter Henry of Manchester and Mrs. Royal Isham of Andover; a sister, Mrs. John Cunningham of Hartford; 21 grandchildren and 26 great-grandchildren.
