

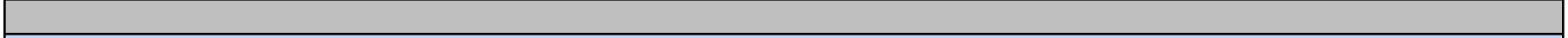
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| Behaviors That Affect Learning |

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| Literacy - Reading in English |
| Reading Standards for Literature |
| Refer to details and examples when explaining what the text says explicitly and when making inferences about the text. |
| Determine a theme of a story, drama, or poem from details in the text; summarize the text. |
| Compare and contrast similar themes and topics. |
| Reading Standards for Informational Text |
| Refer to details and examples in a text when explaining what the text says explicitly and when drawing inferences from the text. |
| Determine the main idea of a text and explain how it is supported by key details; summarize the text. |
| Describe the structure (e.g., chronology, comparison, cause/effect, problem/solution) of events, ideas, concepts, or information in a text or part of a text. |
| Interpret information presented visually, orally, or quantitatively (e.g., in charts, graphs, diagrams, timelines, animations, or interactive |

elements on Web pages) and explain how the information helps the reader understand the text.

Integrate information from two texts on the same topic in order to write or speak about the subject knowledgeably.

Reading Standards for Informational Text

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Integrate information from two texts on the same topic in order to write or speak about the subject knowledgeably.

Literacy - Writing in English



Write opinion pieces on topics or texts, supporting a point of view with reasons and information.

Write informative/explanatory texts to examine a topic and convey ideas and information clearly.

Write narratives to develop real or imagined experiences or events using descriptive details and clear event sequences.

Use evidence from literary or informational texts to support analysis, reflection, and research.

Operations and Algebraic Thinking

Multiply or divide to solve word problems e.g., using drawings and equations with a symbol for the unknown number to represent the problem.

Solve multistep word problems with whole numbers using appropriate operations.

Number and Operations in Base Ten

Recognize that in a multi-digit whole number, a digit in one place represents ten times what it represents in the place to its right.

Compare two multi-digit numbers based on the meanings of the digits in each place, using $>$, $=$, and $<$ symbols to record the results of comparisons.

Fluently add and subtract multi-digit whole numbers using the standard algorithm.

Multiply multi-digit whole numbers. Illustrate and explain the calculation by using equations, rectangular arrays, and/or area models.

Divide multi-digit numbers by a one-digit divisor. Illustrate and explain the calculation by using equations, rectangular arrays, and/or area models.

Number and Operations—Fractions

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| Compare and order fractions. |
| Add and subtract mixed numbers with like denominators. |
| Solve word problems using addition and subtraction of fractions with like denominators. |
| Solve word problems involving multiplication of a fraction by a whole number. |
| Read, write and compare decimals to the hundredth place. |

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| Science |
| Measure and graph quantities to provide evidence that regardless of the type of change that occurs when heating, cooling, or mixing substances, the total weight of matter is conserved. |
| Use models to describe that energy in animals' food (used for body repair, growth, motion, and to maintain body warmth) was once energy from the sun. |
| Support an argument that differences in the apparent brightness of the sun compared to other stars is due to their relative distances from Earth. |

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| Social Studies |
| Uses geography to interpret the past and predict the future consequences of human actions. |
| Identifies geographic elements and the natural, human, and capital resources available within a region and how they impact daily life and culture. |
| Explains concepts of a historical event. |
| Identifies core civic virtues and democratic principles that guide our state and nation. |
| Understands how and why rules and laws evolve over time. |
