<u>Adopt</u>	Verb	The company has adopted a new policy regarding product returns and exchanges.
<u>Obligatory</u>	Adjective	In this class, it is obligatory not to use your cell phones.
<u>Gauge</u>	Noun / Verb	He has no expression at all. It is nearly impossible to gauge what he will do next.
<u>Sympathize (US - sympathise)</u>	Verb	It is very difficult to sympathize with you as I have told you numerous times to stop skipping class.

<u>Gripe</u>	Verb	It is common to gripe about the weather when living in England.
<u>Fulfill</u>	Verb	If I do not get a good score on the test, I will not fulfill my goal of going to university this year.
<u>Counterpart</u>	Noun	The manager of LG was recently seen with his Samsung counterpart.
<u>Status</u>	Noun	The status of the decision is still unknown.
<u>Ornament</u>	Noun	The Christmas tree is decorated with such beautiful ornaments.
<u>Bum (Homeless)</u>	Noun (Slang)	That street has too many bums.
<u>Decoration</u>	Noun	Starbucks usually starts displaying Christmas decorations in October.
<u>Sentimental</u>	Adjective	This necklace is not just a necklace. It has sentimental value to me.
<u>Haggle</u>	Verb	In some countries, it is expected that customers and salespeople haggle over prices.
<u>Punch (drink)</u>	Noun	The punch served at the party was too sweet for me.
<u>Insane</u>	Adjective	Many homeless people may be a little insane.
<u>To count on somebody</u>	Phrasal Verb	I really do not want to buy this many cookies. I cannot count on myself to avoid eating them all at once!
<u>Crappy</u>	Adjective (Slang)	The weather is beautiful right now, but it will get pretty crappy next month.
<u>To flunk out of school</u>	Phrase (Slang)	The student has not been seen by any of his friends since he flunked out of school.

<u>Dumb</u>	Adjective (Slang)	I really found the movie last night to be quite dumb.
<u>Distribute</u>	Verb	The teacher will distribute the tests.
<u>Make out (kiss)</u>	Phrasal Verb (Slang)	I couldn't believe that the people were making out on the train in front of everybody.
<u>Break up</u>	Phrasal Verb	John and Wendy should break up. They are always fighting.
<u>Evolve</u>	Verb	If you don't do anything about the problem now, it will evolve into something much bigger soon.
<u>Peer</u>	Noun	I am much more comfortable around my peers. I always get nervous talking to my boss.
<u>Equinox</u>	Noun	The fall equinox takes place in September.
<u>Festivity</u>	Noun	There will be many festivities around town to celebrate the victory of the soccer team.
<u>Livestock</u>	Noun	My father has a really big farm. He raises livestock.
<u>Crop</u>	Noun	Most of the crops were destroyed in the flood.

<u>Broadcast</u>	Noun / Verb	This show is broadcast in twelve different countries.
<u>Landmark</u>	Noun	When we travel, my parents are mainly interested in seeing the important landmarks.
<u>Align</u>	Verb	My crazy friend believes she will meet her soul mate when Earth aligns with Mars.
<u>Float</u>	Verb	It is very easy to float in the Dead Sea due to the large amount of salt.
<u>Gravity</u>	Noun	Although I don't think I would like to visit Space, I would love to feel zero-gravity.
<u>Rotate</u>	Verb	It takes 24 hours for Earth to rotate 360 degrees.
