Proposed changes to Longview Park Disc Golf

A: Pins moved, Tee pads poured.

Tee Sizes: The PDGA says "Minimum rectangular size is 4 feet (1.2m) wide by 10 feet (3m) long" on #5 on this article:

- B: Shrubs planted, wet garden planted behind 18B, short grasses planted on slopes where the city can't mow. (Friends of Longview, QCDGA)
- C: There are many places where a naturalized prairie habitat with local plant life would be both beautiful and functional for defining the edges of the fairways. (Friends of Longview, QCDGA)
- D: The baskets are in need of updating. We want to ask the city if they are able to help with this process, otherwise, if they are willing, we can start fundraising for new baskets as soon as possible. I would propose the current baskets get donated to schools in the RI school district.

All 18 holes will need tee pads and sleeves poured.

Holes 5, 10, 11, 12, 14 are sloped and will need dug out/leveled, built up on the side. Picture examples are included in the following pages.

The following is extra changes that would be needed if the layout is approved.

- 1. Two pin positions, 1A for when 18B is in play, 1B for when 18A is in play.
- 2-5. None
- 6. We want to stake out an Out of Bounds section (see map) on this green by the basket. We also wish to elevate the basket, using a longer pole. QCDGA will take care of this process.
- 7. This one is on a slope and in a place where the city has not mowed. We hope to have the city or FoL help clear this one, and maybe plant some short growth that does not need mowed often.
- 8-9. None
- 10. Trim branches on the left side from the big tree. Trim the left side branches of the pine tree to open a rectangle shape to throw towards the basket. Have the city mow a 30' strip down to the basket.
- 11. QCDGA and Friends of Longview are open to cleaning up the green on this hole. There are small trees that need trimmed and cleaned up, as well as lots of garbage that has accumulated here.
- 12. None FoL suggested we may need people to help with the concrete on this slope.
- 13. The weeds in the lagoon are problematic to players currently. Prior to the restoration of the lagoon, we might need to address the overgrowth between the basket and the tee pad. We will

utilize the staircase left of the basket that leads up the hill directly towards the next tee pad. It needs very little cleaning up as well as a defined path from basket to the stairs.

18. Two pin positions, 18A for when 1B is in plan, 18B for when 1A is in play.
