Principal Update:

- Students went out today to spell Go Eagles. Students have been excited. Been a great few months for sports!

Teacher Update (Mrs. Bennamy):

- Instrumental and choral concert was fantastic. Covid took away a lot of their ability to sing in groups. It's great to see them together.

- Assembly: this year has shown that we are doing our best to make sure our kids are SEEN. Assembly was incredibly impactful for students and staff. Southeast Asian students were really positively impacted
