### **Lunches in schools**

# Toys/Jewellery at school reminder

If your child brings toys, or jewellery they will be held in the office for collection at the end of the week. This applies to gibbets on crocs too.

If they are bringing something special for news they can hand it in to their teacher for safe keeping.

Please be aware that the way you behave on the school bus has an impact not only on the bus driver, but other students on the bus. It is important that you stay seated, talk quietly and sensibly, and a thank you to the driver as you depart would be a kind gesture. If any student is misbehaving on the bus it can put all those aboard in a vulnerable situation. The school has the right to withdraw those students not abiding by the rules.
