Particular emphasis is placed on decision-making and problem-solving techniques for applying, science, mathematics, communications, and social studies concepts to solve technological problems. In addition, students are provided with instruction and training regarding the proper care, maintenance, and sue of tools and equipment as well as information regarding applicable local, state and federal safety and environmental regulations. Hands-on work experience and SKILLS USA leadership activities provide many opportunities to enhance classroom instruction and career development
