School History

Christ Classical Academy opened in 2015 with 4 teachers and 20 students in Kindergarten thru 8th grade. CCA grew each year by 20-30% to currently include Transitional Kindergarten-12th grade. Christ Classical Academy offers a rigorous Classical Christian education that challenges students in the *trivium*. The *trivium* emphasizes concrete thinking and memorization of the facts in elementary school; analytical thinking and understanding of the subjects in middle

school; and abstract thinking and articulation of the subjects in high school. Our enrollment comprises students residing in Burke, Caldwell and Catawba Counties, North Carolina.

A Classical Christian Education

A classical education depends on a three-part process of training the mind known as the *trivium*. The first years of schooling are called the "Grammar Stage". At Christ Classical Academy (CCA) the grammar stage includes TK-6th grade and are the years in which the building blocks for all other learning are laid, just as grammar is the foundation for language. During this period, education involves learning of facts as students find memorization fun at this age. Students are like sponges soaking up facts and information they will use as a foundation for the next stage of the trivium.

The second stage of classical schooling is called the "Logic Stage". At CCA, the logic stage includes 7th-8th grades and is when a child's mind begins to think more analytically. Students are less interested in knowing facts and more interested in understanding "Why?" The child begins to pay attention to cause and effect, relationships and the way facts fit together into a logical framework.

The final phase of a classical education at CCA is the "Rhetoric Stage," which includes 9th - 12th grade. This stage builds on the first two stages. At this point, the high school student learns to write and speak with force and

originality. The student of rhetoric applies the rules of logic learning in middle school to the foundational information learned in the early grades and expresses his conclusions in clear, precise, elegant language.

The student of classical education will first be supplied with facts and images, then given the logical tools for organization of facts, and finally equipped to express conclusions.

Curriculum

CCA is a *classical* school; therefore, our curriculum is not like most Christian schools. While other Christian schools use Bob Jones University Press and Abeka Publishers almost exclusively, CCA uses very little from either Company. Students who attend CCA from Transitional Kindergarten through 12th grade will have received an education that includes

- Thorough instruction in phonics and math facts: TK-4th grade
- Rigorous instruction in classical and modern Western literature and history: 1st -12th grade
- Intensive instruction in English grammar, vocabulary and spelling: 1st
 -8th grade
- Demanding instruction in writing: essays, research papers, and thesis papers/presentations: 5th -12th grade
- Comprehensive foundation in math:1st-8th grade
- Focused instruction in Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II,

- Trigonometry/Pre-Calculus: 8th (Honors) 12th
- Comprehensive foundations in science:1st -8th grade
- Instruction in high school lab sciences: Biology, Chemistry, Anatomy and Physiology, Environmental Science: 9-12th grade
- Five years of Latin instruction: 3rd -7th grade
- Two years of formal Logic: 8th-9th grade
- A half year of formal Rhetoric: 11th grade, a full year of formal Rhetoric: 12th grade
- Thorough training in the Scriptures: TK-12th grade
- Training in fine arts, including the study of great artists and classical composers: 1st-6th grade
- Opportunity for further fine arts training through Beginner, Concert and Jazz Band, Chorus and Art Classes 5th
 -11th grade, as available

Grade Point Average

GPA is on a 4.0 scale and is weighted. It is computed at the end of each semester and includes all courses taken in 9th-12th grades. Grades are weighted with an additional 1.0 quality point in honors courses.

Class Rank

Students enrolled at CCA need high average to superior academic and cognitive ability in order to successfully complete the curriculum. CCA does not report class rank since it may not be an accurate indication of ability or effort as students are being compared to a small peer group.

Dual Enrollment

Students have the opportunity to take college level classes or specialized electives, if desired, through Western Piedmont Community College and Liberty University Online Academy.
