



Observers: Viewing Student Submissions and Teacher Feedback

Viewing feedback from your child's teacher is a great way to understand how they are doing in the course and how they can continue to move forward in their learning. Encouraging students to view this feedback will also encourage a feeling of connection with their teacher regardless of the learning environment.

Grades in the Course Navigation Menu

NOTE: All official grade information is posted inside PowerSchool. The Grades tab within Canvas will allow you to see student submissions and assignment feedback, but you must go to PowerSchool to see your student's standards-based grades.

1. From the Canvas Dashboard, choose the course you would like to view feedback in.
2. From within that course, choose grades.



3. Click the rubric icon [R] to view rubric notes and the comment button [C] to see specific teacher comments. *Please note that not every assignment has a comment or rubric.*

4. Click on the assignment name in order to view student submissions. There are different steps to take in order to view the various assignment types.

Type of Assignment	Steps
Canvas Quiz Canvas Survey	Click on the assignment name in order to view student submissions. Once opened, you may scroll down and see the student's responses. Additional teacher comments will be to the right. They can be written, audio file, or a video file.
External Tool - Google Document Google Presentation	In the Grades tab, these documents will appear to be a Word document or a PowerPoint file. Click the "View Feedback" link. Once it opens, you can scroll and see the student's responses. Additional teacher comments will be to the right. They can be written, audio file, or a video file.
External Tool - Kami	Click on the assignment name in order to view student submissions. Click the "View Feedback" link. Once it opens, you will see the blank Kami file. To view the submission, click on the file in the toolbar at the top. It will say Open File.  Under Recent Files, choose the file with your child's name. It will open to the submission. <u>BUT</u>, this does not work all the time. Here are two other ways to see your child's submissions: - You can log in to Canvas as your child to see the complete submissions. Your child can share his/her login information. - In your child's Google Drive, there is a folder called Kami. The submissions will be in that folder. Your child can share his/her login information. Additional teacher comments will be to the right. They can be written, audio file, or a video file.
File Upload - pdf	Click on the assignment name in order to view student submissions. Click the "View Feedback" link. Once it opens, you can
