Diplomatic relations and mutual recognition treaty between:

On one hand, the Governorate of Græcia

On the other hand, the Republic of Ceneda

Hereafter known as “the parties”

Preamble

Be it known that the parties, acting on behalf of their micronations through peaceful dialogue and diplomacy; hereby declare each other's recognition as micronational entities, and as base for such decision, deliberate:

To conclude the Diplomatic relations and mutual recognition treaty consisting of the following points, as proof of a good will existing between the Governorate of Græcia and the Republic of Ceneda.

It is the obligation of micronations in signature of this treaty to follow these regulations and procedures and for the heads of state to pursue peace and understanding of both micronations.

Parties

For the Governorate of Græcia

- His Excellency The Governor Quintus II De Vitaliis

For the Republic of Ceneda

- His Excellency The Campanaro di Stato Andrea Grava

Article I

Through the signing of the Diplomatic relations and mutual recognition treaty, the parties recognise each other's microstates as sovereign and/or independent; within the legitimacy of the documents, issued by those included.

Article II

Both parties must respect each other's symbols (flags, coats of arms, emblems, anthems, etc.) and cultural aspects (religion, religious denomination, language(s), dialect(s), e.a.), as part of the recognition of their integrity.



Article III

Both parties are free to establish relations and sign treaties and/or agreements with other micronations and/or inter-micronational entities, without this binding the other party.

Article IV

It is through this mutual recognition that both parties establish formal diplomatic relations in conformity with their respective constitutions, without contradiction; in other words, both parties officially declare that their respective constitutions do not collide with this treaty's articles.

Article V

The parties have agreed to develop their friendly relations of co-operation in respect to the principles of mutual respect for sovereignty and territorial integrity, mutual non-aggression, non-interference in each other's internal affairs; unless formally asked, and peaceful coexistence. In other words, one party's views and policies have no power over the other party's code of conduct - and vice versa.

Article VI

It is through this bilateral agreement that both parties clarify the following:

- I. One party's laws do not apply to the other - and vice versa.
- II. One party has no intention of conquering the other - and vice versa.
- III. One party claims no land belonging to the other - and vice versa.
- IV. The policies of one party do not impede the other - and vice versa.
- V. If asked, one party can arbitrate between the other and a third party - and vice versa.
- VI. One party is obliged to acknowledge the head of state of the other - and vice versa.
- VII. One party is obliged to acknowledge the other party's territorial change - and vice versa.
- VIII. One party's opinion must not affect the other party's policies - and vice versa.
- IX. One party must not impose macronational propaganda on the other - and vice versa.
- X. One party's international affiliations create no obligations for the other - and vice versa.

Article VII

The parties formally agree to help each other push off any form of forced foreign, third-party influence that may pose threat to the social, cultural and/or economical integrity of any of the two aforementioned parties.

Article VIII

Any third parties not involved in this treaty or somehow involved in each party's affairs are not free to complain about the aforementioned articles - they are welcome to either stay silent or terminate their cooperation with said party.



Postamble

Both parties are satisfied with their communication so far and are looking forward to a lasting friendship and collaboration. Withdrawal is possible only prior to or one (1) week after the signing of this treaty. Furthermore, both parties promise to respect each other's internal and external affairs, including those that may seem relevant to one party's own affairs. It is through this treaty that both parties also show a powerful alliance against externally oriented powers that threaten the integrity of both aforementioned parties.

The individuals involved in the signing of this treaty formally state that they respect each other's opinion, but pledge to abstain from unnecessary comments and/or arguments, by respecting the "to each his own" principle, which will be applied right after the finalisation of the signing of said treaty, effective immediately. Both individuals have the right to express their different opinions, if apparent, according to the "Freedom of Speech" act imposed by the Governorate of Græcia in their digital spaces. If any member of one of the signatory parties clearly disrespects an aspect that is protected by the aforementioned treaty (articles II, V, and VI), the diplomatic relations will be terminated immediately, without formally affecting the mutual recognition part of the treaty, unless stated otherwise.

It is through God's grace that this treaty be respected and cherished; it is through our Lord's mercy that both micronations are able to conduct diplomacy; it is through our Saviour's will that both parties will develop a peaceful coexistence, cooperation and diplomacy, without unnecessary barriers.
