Course description:	Students will show an understanding of ideas, language features, and how texts are created and structured for different purposes and audiences. The course consists of three full-year units of learning (Personal Reading, Writing Portfolio and Language Skills) which are ongoing throughout the year and six shorter units (Extended Written Text, Film Study, Static Image, Speech, Short Texts and Choose Your Own Learning Adventure) which usually run for 5 weeks each. The course will include 2 internally-assessed NCEA Level 1 Achievement Standards integrated into the Year 10 programme. Students may gain up to 6 credits towards Level 1 NCEA (all 6

In addition, asTTle Writing, PAT Reading Comprehension, PAT Listening Comprehension and Education Perfect grammar tests are run at the start of the year and PAT Reading and AsTTle Writing and Education Perfect at the end of the year. All these will be reported in the KAMAR mark book.
