Identified Barrier	Variability and Flexibility Strategies
Transportation Issues that lead to absences, late arrivals, or leaving early.	 Groups of learning clubs for students Tardy policies: 5 minute, 3 excused passes Greeting students with a warm welcome, no matter when they get there Let students build community norms. Explain why on-time is important but allow late arrivals when it happens.
Uncomfortable asking professors for help or support.	 Providing office hours, encourage students to schedule time. Asking them to come and ask questions or to chat. Provide diff options for where and when to meet. "If these don't work, please email me to see if we can find another time:" Offering other alternatives, like email (timely responses) Communicate to students using their preferred mode (Inbox, email, phone) Liquid syllabus with resources Student forum to ask student questions Texting (Google phone number) Variable office hours to accommodate students

Identified Barrier	Variability and Flexibility Strategies
Difficulty balancing work and family.	 Some flexibility in due dates. Due date pass Ask students what they need! If due date is missed, ask student when they can get turned in. Excusing 2 assignments.

Student Motivators	Variability and Flexibility Strategies
Positive interaction with a professor.	 Feedback on assignments (doing well)(reaching out if need help) Day 1 let students know that these obstacles aren't there by putting in Syllabus and emphasizing in class. Sending email message welcoming students to class before it starts (all modalities); reminders of parking challenges, providing campus map, etc.
Different ways to learn course content.	 Watch videos or use this reading to earn credit - different formats for instructional content Varying the pace Change speed of videos
