St. Maximilian Kolbe had a great devotion to the Blessed Virgin. The below book provides a 33 day retreat to Marian consecration. Marian consecration is a consecration to Jesus through Mary. Saint John Paul II described his own consecration, after studying one of the books this retreat is based on, as a "turning point" in his life. This is a do-it-yourself retreat done in your home. Each day requires approximately 15 minutes to read the teachings, then you will find yourself pondering those teachings throughout your normal day. The retreat focuses on the teachings of 4 Marian experts, St. Maximilian Kolbe, St. Mother Teresa, St. John Paul II, and St. Louis de Montfort. We encourage everyone to prayerfully consider doing this retreat on your own or as a group. Some in the Sacred Heart community are planning to begin the retreat on September 4 and end on October 7, Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. The group retreat will still be done individually in our homes, but we will setup a chat group of members who want to communicate throughout the retreat about the teachings.
